India's first quantum reference facilities unveiled in Amaravati

Amaravati, April 14 : India's first quantum reference facilities were unveiled here on Tuesday, opening a new chapter in quantum technology to mark the World Quantum Day. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu inaugurated the 'IS Open Access Quantum Facility' at SRM University, as well as the 'IQ Quantum Facility' situated at Medha Towers. These two quantum testbeds provide the necessary infrastructure to test quantum computing devices and components, officials said. With the unveiling of these two systems, Andhra Pradesh has become the first state in the country to have a dedicated Quantum Test Reference



Facility. With this, the Amaravati Quantum Valley has acquired the capability to test and certify quantum computer hardware. Quantum computer testbeds—designed to operate at an ultra-

low temperature of minus 273 degrees Celsius—have been established at both locations. These quantum testbeds are designed to serve the needs of companies manufacturing quantum computing devices, as well as researchers, students, and industry experts. The Amaravati IS facility at SRM University will facilitate research, while the Amaravati IQ facility at Medha Towers will cater to industrial applications. Representatives from the National Quantum Mission and the Department of Science and Technology (DST), along with delegates from various quantum technology companies, IIT professors, and scientists, attended this event. Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu said that Andhra Pradesh has created history by realising this milestone on World Quantum Day, coinciding with the centenary of Quantum Science.

"We have ushered in a new era of quantum history in Amaravati on the birth anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar—the visionary who proclaimed that knowledge is the true symbol of social progress," he said. He expressed his gratitude to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for encouraging the establishment of the Amaravati Quantum Valley—a key initiative in setting up India's first open-access quantum facilities. The Chief Minister stated that IS and IQ quantum hardware testbeds, launched in Amaravati, will play a pivotal role in testing and certifying quantum devices. CM Chandrababu Naidu writes to all MPs from Andhra Pradesh to support women's quota bill

Amaravati, April 14 : Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has written a letter to the heads of political parties in the state and Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha members from the state seeking their support in Parliament for the Women's Reservation Bill. He has requested them to extend their support to the 'Nari Shakti Vandan' Constitution Amendment Bill, which aims to implement 33 per cent reservations starting from the 2029 elections. The national president of the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) said that he has



appealed to them to strengthen Prime Minister Narendra Modi's resolve to provide one-third reservations for women in Parliament and Assemblies. Chandrababu Naidu stated that the introduction of the Women's Reservation Amendment Bill in

Parliament on April 16 will be a historic milestone in Indian democracy. He believes that 'Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam' will contribute to women's empowerment as well as the nation's progress. (Contd. on pg.2)

PM Modi inaugurates Rs.12,000 cr Delhi-Dehradun corridor with Asia's longest wildlife stretch

Dehradun, April 14: A major highway project linking Delhi to Uttarakhand is now operational, promising faster travel, improved connectivity and integrated wildlife protection measures across ecologically sensitive zones. Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday inaugurated the Delhi-Dehradun Economic Corridor in Dehradun, capping a day marked by roadshows, a wildlife corridor review and a temple visit in Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh. The 213-km-long, access-controlled corridor, built at a cost of over Rs 12,000 crore, is expected to sig-



nificantly cut travel time between Delhi and Dehradun from more than six hours to around 2.5 hours, boosting connectivity across Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand. At the public function in Dehradun, the Prime Minister was felicitated by Union Minister for

Women's quota: Govt circulates amendment bill text, aims to raise LS seats to 850



New Delhi, April 14 : The Union government on Tuesday shared with MPs the text of Constitution (131 Amendment) Bill, 2026 or the proposed amendment to the Women Reservation Bill which aims to raise Lok Sabha seats to 850 – including members from States and Union Territories. The Bill proposes a cap of 815 on the number of members chosen by direct election from constituencies in the States.

For UTs, the Bill says, "Not more than 35 members to represent the Union Territories, chosen in such manner as Parliament may by law provide". At present, there are 530 Lok Sabha members from States and 20 from UTs. However, a delimitation commission had set the number at 543. Another key amendment proposed in the Bill is the definition of population, (Contd. on pg.2)

Saudi Arabia is 'pressing' US to drop Iran Port blockade plan: Report

Riyadh, April 14: The US-Israel war against Iran and the closure of the Strait of Hormuz have shattered a status quo that prevailed among Middle East oil and gas producers for decades. America's Gulf ally, Saudi Arabia, is now reportedly worried that President Donald Trump's move to block the Iranian port may worsen the situation. Riyadh is reportedly 'pressing' the Donald Trump administration to 'drop its blockade of the Strait of Hormuz and

return to the negotiating table', according to a Wall Street Journal report. Arab officials told the American publication that Saudi Arabia fears that Trump's move to close Iranian ports could lead Tehran to escalate and disrupt other important shipping routes. The US decision to blockade all Iranian shipments out of or into the Strait of Hormuz is aimed at raising the pressure on Iran's already crippled economy. But Saudi Arabia has reportedly warned the US that Iran might retaliate by



closing the Bab al-Mandeb -- a Red Sea chokepoint crucial for the kingdom's remaining oil exports. **Gulf Worries**

Over the six weeks of war, Tehran has now demonstrated both its ability and willingness to seal off the critical waterway and strike vital infrastructure

across the region, fundamentally altering the risk calculus for its neighbours and jeopardising Gulf countries' long-term oil and gas strategies. Saudi Arabia, after weeks of disruption, managed to get its oil exports back up to their prewar level of around seven million barrels a day by piping its crude across the desert to the Red Sea, while Iran's Hormuz blockade persisted. Riyadh is worried those supplies would be at risk if the Red Sea's exit (Contd. on pg.2)

Length and cost: 213 km, developed at a cost of over Rs 12,000 crore

Connectivity: Passes through Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand

Key structures: 10 interchanges, three Railway Over Bridges, four major bridges

Commuter facilities: 12 wayside amenities for long-distance travellers

Safety systems: Advanced Traffic Management System to improve traffic flow and safety

Officials say the corridor has been designed keeping in mind the ecological sensitivity and biodiversity of the region, with specific features aimed at reducing man-animal conflict and ensuring safe wildlife movement.

Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami said, "Prime Minister, today, under your leadership and guidance, Uttarakhand is working in every field in accordance with the concept of both development and heritage to fulfill its unwavering resolve to become the best state in the country. China Slams US Blockade Of Iranian Ports

Meanwhile, China accused the United States of "dangerous and irresponsible" behaviour over its blockade of Iranian ports on Tuesday, with Xi vowing Beijing would play a "constructive role" in promoting peace in the Middle East.

US President Donald Trump has threatened to sink ships entering or leaving Iranian ports and coastal areas in the Gulf after peace talks between Washington and Tehran failed over the weekend.

Iran has effectively closed the vital Strait of Hormuz, allowing only vessels serving countries it deems friendly, such as China, to cross.

Trump's 50% Tariff Threat For China

Trump said on Sunday that he would hit China's goods with a 50 per cent tariff if it provided military assistance to Tehran.

Guo Jiakun, the Chinese foreign ministry spokesman, dismissed those reports as "completely fabricated."

"If the US insists on using this as an excuse to impose additional tariffs on China, China will definitely take resolute countermeasures," Guo said.

Trump is scheduled to visit Beijing next month for talks with Xi.

For modifying clause (3) of article 81 of the Constitution, the Bill proposes, "(3) In this article, the expression 'population' means the population as ascertained at such census, as Parliament may by law determine, of which the relevant figures have been published."

The Union Cabinet had recently cleared the Bill seeking to amend the Constitution for early implementation of 33 per cent quota for women in Lok Sabha and Assemblies, as well as increasing the number of seats in the lower house of Parliament.

The amendment Bill also proposes changes in article 82 to substitute "Upon the completion of each census, the allocation of seats" with words "The allocation of seats".

The proposed amendment aims to delink the quota's implementation from the 2027 Census and instead base it on the 2011 Census, enabling its rollout before the 2029 general elections.

In article 82, the amendment Bill also proposes to introduce a role for the Delimitation Commission.

The Bill states that in article 82 (c) of the Constitution, "for the words 'by such authority and in such manner', the words 'in such manner and on the basis of such census, by the Delimitation Commission', shall be substituted".

The Bill also talks about reservation of seats on rotation basis in Lok Sabha and Assemblies and carries paras related to the tenure for which the women's reservation shall remain in force, subject to extension by Parliament.

Earlier in the day, Union Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju asserted that there is "nothing controversial" in the proposed amendment to the Women's Reservation Bill and appealed to all political parties to support it without politicising the issue.

Speaking to IANS, Rijiju said, "The issue of women's reservation cannot be made a political matter in any form. If we give it a political angle, it would be an injustice to women."

"The Prime Minister has made a very simple and clear appeal to rise above party politics. The Nari Shakti Adhinyam (Women's Reservation Act) is a law that all parties supported and passed unanimously. Now, we have called for a special session to make a constitutional amendment to implement it," said Rijiju.

The government has convened a special three-day Parliament session from April 16 to discuss and pass the "Nari Shakti Vandan Adhinyam".

hurry, but developed naturally over generations. Sai Reddy suggested that the same approach is needed in the construction of Amaravati. Iran's Bab Al-Mandeb Warning

Iran's semi-official Tasnim news agency, which is close to the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps, has reported that the US blockade of Iranian ports could lead the country to close the Red Sea gateway.

Ali Akbar Velayati, a foreign-policy adviser to Iran's supreme leader, said in a social media post on April 5 that Tehran looks at Bab al-Mandeb "just as it looks at Hormuz. And if the White House thinks of repeating its stupid mistakes, it will quickly realise that the flow of global energy and trade can be disrupted with a single signal."

"If the security of Iran's ports in the Persian Gulf and the Sea of Oman is threatened, no port in the Persian Gulf and the Sea of Oman will be safe," Iran's armed forces said in a statement published by state-run IRIB News.

US Limitations in War: The war has sharply exposed how vulnerable the Middle Eastern energy infrastructure is. Now, the pushback by Saudi Arabia also exposes the limitations of US efforts to pry open the critical waterway, through which 20 per cent of global oil and liquefied petroleum gas (LNG) passes in peacetime.

Heatwave Warnings Issued Across AP and Telangana

Andhra Pradesh: Apr 14

As temperatures soar across the state, the Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority has issued urgent warnings, advising people to avoid outdoor activities between 12:00 PM and 4:00 PM. Record-high temperatures and intensifying heatwaves have led authorities to urge vigilance, with the scorching sun already affecting daily life from as early as 8:00 AM. Health articles The Meteorological Department predicts that on 14 April, several districts in Rayalaseema and Coastal Andhra will experience severe heatwave conditions. In particular, 33 mandals across Eluru, Polavaram, Vizianagaram, Srikakulam, Parvathipuram Manyam, and Alluri Sitarama Raju districts are expected to face extreme heat, with moderate conditions in another 44 mandals. Specific mandals in Polavaram, Srikakulam,



Vizianagaram, and Parvathipuram Manyam districts are forecast to endure the worst of the heat. On Monday, Kadapa recorded a maximum temperature of 44.4°C, with Sanjamala in Nandyal district reaching 44°C. Durgi in Palnadu district and Nuliveedu in Annamaya district registered 42.8°C and 42°C respectively. The Meteorological Department advised residents to wear hats or carry umbrellas when outdoors and to stay well-hydrated, emphasising the increased risk of heatstroke. Meanwhile, in Telangana,

the Hyderabad Meteorological Department warned that the heatwave is likely to continue throughout the week, with temperatures expected to rise by 2 to 3 degrees. On Monday, four fatalities due to heatstroke were reported in the state. Nizamabad recorded a maximum temperature of 43.2°C, while Hyderabad's temperature exceeded 40°C. City streets are largely deserted during the afternoons, as residents avoid the intense heat, which is expected to persist for several more days.

TDP leader demands rectification of land record discrepancies



Puttaparthi: Apr 14

Dharmavaram TDP in-charge Paritala Sriram has urged the district administration to rectify alleged irregularities in land records arising from the resurvey conducted during the previous government and ensure justice to affected farmers. Sriram participated in the public grievance redressal programme held at the district collectorate on Monday, where he met Joint Collector Maurya Bharadwaj and submitted representations on several issues. He alleged that land records were manipulated over the past five years, resulting in discrepancies where some individuals without ownership were recorded as landholders, while genuine farmers were deprived of their rights. He highlighted concerns from Kunukuntla village in Tadimarri mandal, stating that the recent resurvey

failed to accurately capture land extent, boundaries, and ownership details, leading to confusion and hardship among farmers. He requested a fresh survey to address these issues. Sriram also raised the plight of farmers in the Jilledu Banda project area of Mudigubba mandal, where land was marked for canal construction nearly two decades ago but no work has been undertaken. He alleged that land extents were reduced in revenue records without compensation and called for restoration of affected lands and fair compensation to all farmers, including those holding assigned lands. He further sought compensation for farmers in Thumparthi, where land was reportedly acquired for housing. The Joint Collector assured that the issues would be examined and appropriate action taken.

Steps to revive Prakasam district dairy will be initiated: Dinakar

Chairman of the Twenty-Point Programme Implementation Committee, Lanka Dinakar, has assured that necessary steps will be taken to revive the Prakasam District Dairy and restore it to its former glory. Speaking at a media conference held in his chamber at the AP Secretariat on Monday, Lanka Dinakar stated that dairy farmers from Prakasam district had submitted a representation requesting the reopening of the dairy. He said the issue would be brought to the attention of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, and appropriate

measures would be taken in the interest of the farming community. Dinakar criticised the previous government, alleging that decisions were taken to hand over the Prakasam District Dairy to private entities. However, as farmers were not in favour of such moves, the private organisations were unable to operate the dairy effectively, he said. He further said that dairy farmers and milk producers are now urging the government to restart the dairy. He assured that he would present their concerns to the Chief Minister and ensure justice is done to the dairy farmers. Expressing concern, he said that if the

dairy is not revived soon, its valuable assets may be lost. Farmers are worried about the possible misuse or deterioration of these assets, he added. Dinakar mentioned that a delegation of dairy farmers, led by Prakasam District BJP Kisan Morcha president Kavuri Vasu, met him and submitted their appeal. He pointed out that under the Prakasam Dairy, milk production, procurement activities, and even the milk powder factory are currently lying unused. He concluded by stating that a field-level assessment would be conducted and concrete steps would be taken to ensure the reopening of the dairy at the earliest.

Solar rooftop units to benefit all, says minister Gottipati

Darsi: Energy Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar inaugurated solar rooftop units installed by 44 SC families under the PM Surya Ghar scheme in Mallampeta Colony, Donakonda Mandal, on Monday. He urged citizens across the state to adopt solar rooftop units to combat rising electricity consumption and mounting power bills. Addressing the gathering, the Minister highlighted that renewable energy is the most viable alternative to reduce electricity costs.

He said that each solar plant can generate up to 300 units of electricity, enabling households to produce power on their own rooftops. The meeting was chaired by Trust Board Chairman Borra Radhakrishna (Gandhi) at the Jammidoddi meeting hall in Vijayawada. Radha Krishna, speaking to the media after the meeting, said several decisions were taken to enhance the overall pilgrim experience. He announced that television screens would be installed within the temple premises and along queue lines to enable devotees to watch the rituals and puja programmes of Goddess Kanaka Durga. He noted that donors have come forward to provide the TVs. The Chairman further stated that the board is planning to sign a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with a hospital to ensure better healthcare support for temple staff. Mass protest organised on housing issues in Vijayawada

CITU, AIDWA and various civic welfare organisations staged a mass protest at the NTR district Collectorate here on Monday, demanding allocation of house sites, construction of houses, registration of existing dwellings and implementation of welfare schemes. A large turnout of people led to tense scenes at the Collectorate. A significant number of participants, including women with infants, joined the agitation, raising slogans against the government over the alleged neglect of housing issues. The premises were packed as protesters submitted thousands of petitions seeking redressal of their grievances. The protesters alleged that successive governments had failed to fulfill promises made during elections. They claimed that assurances to provide two cents of land for housing in urban areas have not been honoured, with any allotments made even after two years. Addressing the gathering, leaders, including CPM State Secretariat member Ch Babu Rao, state committee member Donepudi Kasinath and AIDWA state president K Sridevi warned that the agitation would continue until the government fulfils its commitments.

The leaders criticised earlier policies, alleging that money was collected from beneficiaries for housing during the previous regime without delivering houses. They also said that many poor families living on hillocks and along the Krishna riverbanks lack ownership documents, making them ineligible for bank loans and welfare benefits. Highlighting issues related to TIDCO housing, the protesters said beneficiaries who paid amounts years ago are still awaiting allotment while bearing the burden of rent and loan interest. They demanded that houses be provided free of cost and pending loans be waived. The agitators further alleged that government lands were being allotted to corporate entities, while the urban poor were denied house sites. They urged the authorities to utilise vacant government lands within the city for housing the needy. District Revenue Officer M Lakshmi Narasimha visited the protest site, received representations and assured that the issues would be examined and appropriate action taken. A delegation also submitted a memorandum to District Collector Dr G Lakshminisha. Several leaders and members of CITU, AIDWA and other organisations participated in the protest.

West Bengal's electoral politics has long turned on a simple but powerful arithmetic: consolidation versus fragmentation. As the state approaches another high-stakes contest, that arithmetic is once again under stress ~ not from ideological realignment, but from the emergence and abrupt unravelling of alternative political vehicles claiming to represent Muslim voters. The brief alignment between MP Asaduddin Owaisi's AIMIM and Humayun Kabir's fledgling AJUP was significant less for its immediate electoral strength than for what it symbolised: a search for political autonomy within a community that has, for over a decade, largely rallied behind chief minister Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress. That search has now collided with the realities of Bengal's polarised political landscape, where even the perception of divided minority votes carries consequences far beyond the fortunes of smaller parties. Mr Kabir's rise in parts of Murshidabad and adjoining districts points to a quiet but real churn. Localised discontent ~ over policy reversals, symbolic gestures, and representation ~ has created openings for new actors.

His attempt to tap into emotive religious imagery, including the proposal to build a mosque modelled on the Babri Masjid, was not accidental. It reflected an understanding that identity, when combined with grievance, can mobilise quickly. Yet, the speed of his ascent has been matched by the speed of his political isolation. The controversy surrounding a purported sting video ~ dismissed by Mr Kabir as AI-generated ~ has done more than trigger a tactical split with AIMIM. It has exposed how fragile such emergent coalitions are in an environment where narrative warfare is as decisive as ground mobilisation. Whether authentic or fabricated, the video achieved its political purpose: it cast doubt, disrupted coordination, and forced a retreat.

For the Trinamool Congress, this episode is less a vindication than a warning. The assumption of a permanently consolidated minority vote is increasingly untenable. Even if fragmentation ultimately benefits the ruling party in a first-past-the-post system, the underlying restlessness it reveals cannot be ignored. Voters may still choose strategic consolidation closer to polling day, but the hesitation is real. For the Bharatiya Janata Party, the dynamics are more straightforward.

A divided opposition, particularly along communal lines, lowers the threshold of victory in closely contested seats. The party does not need to win over large sections of minority voters; it needs only to ensure that they do not vote cohesively against it. What this moment underscores is a deeper transformation in Bengal's politics. Electoral outcomes are no longer shaped solely by party organisation or ideological appeal, but by the management of perception ~ through alliances, counter-narratives, and increasingly, contested digital content. In such a landscape, the line between political strategy and information manipulation is becoming harder to discern. The risk, ultimately, is that democratic choice itself becomes secondary to the orchestration of doubt

Ambedkar Jayanti is a moment to rethink power and language

Everyday language in India continues to reflect deeply embedded social hierarchies. What often appears as courtesy or cultural practice may, in fact, encode patterns of power, deference and social ordering. These linguistic norms are not confined to the private sphere; they are visible within public institutions, particularly in administrative settings, where they shape both behaviour and perception. In government offices, the use of the word "Sir" has evolved into a convention that extends beyond simple politeness. It structures communication, frames interaction, and, at times, signals hierarchy. Its presence is routine; its absence is often noted and occasionally interpreted. What is expressed as respect may also function as a marker of unequal positioning, subtly reinforcing authority gradients within institutions. Language is not merely descriptive; it plays a constitutive role in shaping behaviour. The repeated use of hierarchical forms of address may discourage open expression and reinforce asymmetries in authority. Over time, such practices can normalise deference and limit the scope for candid engagement. This is particularly relevant in administrative systems where effective decision-making often depends on the free flow of information, feedback, and dissent. The origins of this pattern can be traced to India's feudal past and its subsequent reinforcement during the colo-

onial period. Administrative language historically served to maintain distance between authority and subject.

While the institutional framework has since undergone significant transformation, elements of this communicative culture have persisted. In contrast, several societies that inherited similar administrative traditions have gradually moved towards more egalitarian modes of interaction, reflecting broader social change. The implications extend beyond internal administrative culture. These conventions also shape how authority is perceived and exercised in interactions with citizens.

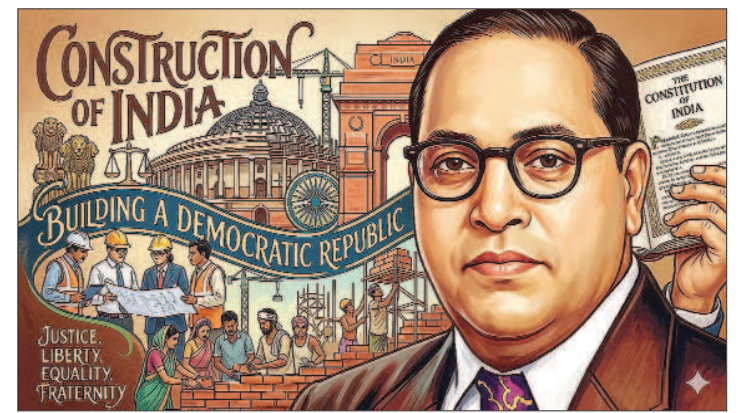
In many cases, routine interactions between citizens and public officials reflect implicit hierarchies, in which the relationship does not always align with the constitutional principle that public servants are accountable to the people. Language, in this sense, becomes a medium through which power is both expressed and internalised. This tension invites reflection, particularly on occasions such as Ambedkar Jayanti. B. R. Ambedkar consistently argued that political democracy must be accompanied by social democracy. The ideals of liberty, equality and fraternity, in his view, required expression not only in constitutional provisions but also in everyday social practices.

A related idea, drawn from his engagement with John Dewey, was that of "social endosmosis"

— the free and natural flow of ideas and experiences across social groups. Such interaction is essential for the functioning of a democratic society. Where communication is structured by rigid hierarchies, this exchange may be constrained, limiting both participation and mutual understanding. The role of language in this context is particularly significant. In many Indian languages, pronouns themselves signal gradations of status and respect. While such distinctions are historically rooted and culturally embedded, they may also reinforce social distance.

Ambedkar's critique of caste as creating "water-tight compartments" offers a useful parallel. Hierarchical patterns in language, even in modern institutional settings, can contribute to similar forms of separation, albeit in more subtle ways. It is therefore pertinent to ask whether the deeper ethos of equality has been fully internalised. While constitutional safeguards and political representation have advanced significantly, social practices often evolve more gradually.

Everyday interactions may continue to reflect inherited hierarchies, even as formal structures emphasise equality and inclusion. This does not suggest that respect should be abandoned. Rather, it points to the need to reconsider how respect is expressed. It may be possible to foster forms of communication that are courteous without being overly deferential, and that



enable openness without undermining institutional roles. A balance between civility and equality is essential for sustaining democratic engagement. Such shifts are unlikely to occur automatically.

They require conscious effort at both institutional and individual levels. Leadership plays a critical role in setting norms. In recent years, the emphasis on citizen-centric governance and administrative responsiveness under Narendra Modi has sought to reduce perceived distance between the state and citizens. Initiatives aimed at improving service delivery and direct engagement have, in effect, fostered more accessible and less hierarchical modes of interaction within governance. When those in positions of authority encourage open dialogue and reduce unnecessary hierarchies in communication, it can signal a broader commitment to participative governance.

Over time, such changes may contribute to more responsive and accountable administrative cultures. Ultimately, the character of a democracy is reflected not only in its formal institutions but also in its social practices. Language, as an everyday medium of interaction, offers an important site for such reflection. Moving towards more equal forms of communication, even incrementally, may help advance the broader ideal of an inclusive and democratic society. As Ambedkar reminded us, democracy is not merely a form of government but a mode of associated living. The persistence of hierarchical language suggests that this transformation remains incomplete. Recognising and gradually reforming such practices may be one of the more practical steps towards realising the egalitarian vision that continues to guide India's constitutional democracy.

A victory or a stalemate?

A day after he tweeted the "whole civilization will die tonight" and hours before his deadline, President Donald Trump announced a ceasefire. The ceasefire was supposedly negotiated by Pakistan with the strong backing of China. Whether it was Pakistan's effort or it was named to prevent credit being given to China is immaterial, a ceasefire is what the world wanted. Markets rebounded and oil prices dropped. The first round of talks in Islamabad ended without any agreement.

The global economy had slid downhill with rising oil, fertilizer, helium, aluminium and gas prices and their shortfalls. Trump's ratings were sinking and the US was alone, abandoned by its allies. An agreement remains essential for Trump to regain his ratings. Immediately after the ceasefire announcement, there were disagreements. Israel was unhappy it was not consulted. Mossad was already tasking its sources to locate the whereabouts of the current Iranian leadership, which it hoped to target next. China had to assure security to the Iranian delegation in Islamabad. Iran and Pakistan had mentioned that the ceasefire included Lebanon, which Israel disagreed with.

The US backed Israel. Netanyahu's increased attacks on Lebanon led to Iran initially reneging on its promise. Trump's sudden interest in re-opening the Strait of Hormuz to lower global oil prices and boost his internal ratings provided Iran with the leverage it

needed. It initially refused to open the strait or participate in discussions until the ceasefire included Lebanon. Israel offered Lebanon talks but resumed attacks on Hezbollah positions. For once, Iran did not blame Israel but the Lebanese PM who it claimed was obstructing the ceasefire by refusing to link it to talks with the US, thereby sidelining Iran and Hezbollah. The announcement of the ceasefire led to all sides declaring victory. Iran's supreme leader, Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei mentioned, "Today, and up to this point, it can boldly be said that you, the heroic nation of Iran, have been the definitive victor in this arena." Trump tweeted that the US had "already met and exceeded all military objectives."

Pete Hegseth stated at a press conference, "Epic Fury decimated Iran's military and rendered it combat-ineffective for years to come." Chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff General Dan Caine mentioned that between 12-13,000 targets were struck, 90 per cent of Iran's navy and missile producing factories destroyed alongside 80 per cent of its air defences. There was no mention of whether political objectives were achieved. What is unknown is whether the US military questioned Trump's plans to engage civilian targets, including those where civilians had formed human chains, aware these could be considered war crimes. The ceasefire stabilized markets and oil prices, providing some relief to Trump. The US did achieve military

success but fell short of their political war aims. Trump and Netanyahu had launched the war seeking regime change. The regime did change, but only within, and possibly became even more hardline. Iran had never controlled Hormuz. It was an international waterway. No longer.

The US burned billions in the war, including losing about 20 aircraft and an equal number of costly UAVs, faced severe damage to its assets in the region, while nuclear fissile material remains in Iran. How long will it take for the US to recreate their expended arsenal remains a question. The war cost Israel over 11 billion Dollars. IRGC's stockpiles of missiles and drones may have depleted but remain formidable. It possesses the ability to attack the Middle East and damage/destroy assets. The war worsened the already weakening relationship within NATO. European nations never considered this to be their war. They had opposed Israel's actions in Gaza, declared Netanyahu as a war criminal, and hence were unwilling to back the US-Israel combine. European nations blocked US aircraft from exploiting their airspace and air bases to attack Iran. Trump threatened to withdraw from NATO, with little effect. The Ukraine war took a backseat and Russia gained by increased sale of its oil and gas. Iran's oil, which was moving by China's shadow ships, became available. Trump had treated his European allies with disdain, threatened to take over Greenland and he was paid back



by zero cooperation when he most needed them. The Middle East would also possibly reconsider its alliance with the US. It is possible that a new security architecture may emerge, without the US. Within the US, Trump's ratings continued to drop.

He was aware that this war would impact mid-term elections scheduled for later this year. Losing control of the Congress would make the remainder of his presidency difficult and open him up to impeachment. The Epstein files, which had been brushed under the carpet during the conflict, re-emerged to haunt him. In other words, the days ahead are unpleasant. Iran on the other hand stood its ground. Its 10-point agenda may not be agreed upon but its demands would be more than what it had demanded in February. It is aware that it holds the world to ransom by controlling the Hormuz Strait, which cannot be taken over militarily without major losses. Its charging for use of the strait to enable rebuilding its infrastructure cannot be easily denied.

If Trump seeks to regain his internal ratings and hope for victory in mid-term polls, he can-

not risk re-engaging Iran in an armed conflict. His only option is economic squeezing of Iran, which he has commenced. Iran has displayed that a nation can hold its own against mighty powers. It needs to be willing to absorb losses and exploit its strengths, which are missiles, drones, global waterways and oil. It has forced both arch-enemy Israel and the US to bend. If it accepts the US's demand of no nuclear weapons and opening facilities to IAEA inspections, it should be compensated well.

It cannot accept limits on missiles as it does not trust Israel's intent. While the US counts victory based on its military objectives, Iran looks at it from its ability to force the US to the bargaining table and its power to control the global economy through Hormuz. It has demonstrated that air power can cause damage but never enforce a surrender. It has also proved that its strategy of wearing down the opposition is sound and plausible as long as the nation stands behind the leadership. It was a battle between air power on one side and missiles and drones on the other. Neither can declare victory. Ultimately, it was a stalemate.

US-Iran likely to return to Islamabad for next round of negotiations this week: Report

With the two-week ceasefire nearing its expiry, the United States and Iran could return to Islamabad this week to the second round of negotiations to end the war, reported Reuters. According to the news agency, a fresh proposal has been shared with both Iran and the US to resend their delegations even as no date has been finalised for the meeting with delegations from Tehran and Washington keeping Friday through Sunday open. The two countries had met in Islamabad on Saturday last week to discuss an agreement to end the conflict but the talks collapsed after they failed to reach consensus on Iran's nuclear ambitions. After the failed Islamabad talks, Trump had apparently suggested that the US and Iranian delegations reached consensus on most of the issues but Tehran's nuclear ambitions were

the key sticking point. According to a New York Times report, the US was pushing for a 20-year ban on Iran's nuclear enrichment. However, Tehran was ready to suspend its nuclear enrichment activities only for five years. The Iranians had reportedly made a very similar proposal in February this year during direct negotiations with the US, a move that prompted the US and Israel to attack Iran. Free passage through the Strait of Hormuz and Iranian proxies like Hezbollah and Hamas is the other critical issues that may hamper the negotiations. The report, however, claimed that the fact that the two sides are now arguing over the time period for suspending nuclear activity suggests that "there may well be room for a deal." Earlier on Monday, Trump claimed that Iran has reached out and wants to "make a deal very



badly". "We've been called by the other side and they want to make a deal very badly," the US President said, adding, "We've been called this morning by the right people on Iran." He, however, clarified the US position on Iran's nuclear ambitions

remains unchanged. "Iran will never have a nuclear weapon. If they don't agree, there's no deal," he added. So far, White House officials have not confirmed another round of meetings but added "in-person negotiations" were being discussed.

Why US-Iran talks hit a wall despite Vance's 'progress' claims

High-level talks between the United States and Iran have stalled without a breakthrough, with US Vice President JD Vance indicating that while discussions showed movement, key differences over Tehran's nuclear programme remain unresolved. The negotiations, held recently in Pakistan, marked a rare moment of direct engagement at the senior-most level between the two sides. However, Washington's insistence on strict conditions, including the removal of enriched uranium and binding guarantees against nuclear weapons development, continues to hold up any agreement. Speaking to Fox News, Vance said the talks produced mixed outcomes. "I wouldn't just say that things went wrong. I also think things went right. We made a lot of progress," he said, describing the meeting as "the first time that you'd ever seen the Iranian government meet at such a high level". Core disagreement remains over nuclear red lines. At the heart of the deadlock is the US position that Iran must never acquire nuclear weapons. Vance made it clear that all American demands stem from this central principle. "I 100% agree with US President Donald Trump on the fact that Iran can't have a nuclear weapon... If they're willing to engage in economic terrorism on the entire world, what would it mean — what leverage would they have — if



they had a nuclear bomb in Tehran?" he said. He outlined two non-negotiable conditions: the removal of Iran's enriched uranium stockpiles and a "conclusive commitment to not develop a nuclear weapon", backed by strict verification. "It's one thing for the Iranians to say that they themselves are never gonna have a nuclear weapon... but you have to, of course, verify these things," he said. While noting that Iranian negotiators had shown some flexibility, Vance added they "didn't move far enough", leading both sides to step back and consult their respective leaderships. 'Economic terrorism' charge and Strait of Hormuz concern Vance also sharpened his criticism of Tehran, accusing it of using global shipping routes as leverage. "Iran was willing to engage in economic terrorism around the world," he said, warning that such actions raise concerns about the country's poten-

tial nuclear ambitions. A key issue flagged by the US is the situation in the Strait of Hormuz, a vital artery for global oil supply. Vance said Washington expects the route to be fully operational. "We need to see the straits... fully open," he said, adding that although there has been "some significant uptick in traffic", "we haven't seen that full reopening". He cautioned that failure to restore normal shipping could alter the course of negotiations. On enforcement, Vance said US naval monitoring extends beyond Iranian vessels. "Any vessel that we know is going to Iranian ports or has come from Iranian ports... we're gonna know," he said, pointing to American intelligence reach. "If the Iranians are gonna try to engage in economic terrorism, we're gonna abide by a simple principle that no Iranian ships are getting out either," he added. Future talks hinge on Tehran's next move

Despite the impasse, Washington has not shut the door on a deal. Vance said there remains a pathway forward if Iran accepts US conditions. "The ball really is in their court," he said, making it clear that the next step depends on Tehran's willingness to commit. He also indicated that Iranian negotiators may not have had the authority to finalise an agreement during the recent round, noting they would need approval from higher authorities back home. The US delegation exited after nearly 21 hours of discussions. "We must have their conclusive commitment not to develop a nuclear weapon. And I think that if the Iranians are willing to meet us there, then this can be a very, very good deal for both countries. If they're not willing to meet us there, that's up to them," Vance said. Reiterating Washington's position of strength, he added: "We have a lot of cards. We have the leverage."

Iran war to push 2.5 million people in India into poverty: UN

The ongoing Iran war could threaten to push 2.5 million people in India into poverty, according to estimates and projections by the United Nations. India is projected to experience some loss in its human development progress, the report said. In a report titled 'Military Escalation In The Middle East: Human Development Impacts Across Asia And The Pacific', the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) noted that the conflict is "widening human development pressures across Asia and the Pacific through higher fuel, freight, and input costs. The shock is diminishing household purchasing power, raising food insecurity, straining public budgets, and weakening livelihoods." UNDP estimates that globally, 8.8 million people are at risk of falling into poverty, while the West Asia mil-



itary escalation could cost the Asia-Pacific up to \$299 billion. In India, poverty is expected to rise from around 400,000 to 2.5 million, the report said. India's poverty rate is estimated to rise to 24.2 per cent post-crisis from 23.9 per cent, pushing 2,464,698 people into poverty. An estimated 354,033,698 people are projected to live in

poverty in the country post-crisis, as compared to 351,569,000 pre-crisis. Globally, the number of people pushed into poverty in the world as a result of the conflict rises from approximately 1.9 million to nearly 8.8 million. South Asia accounted for the largest share, ranging from about 1.7 million to over 8 million, reflecting both the subregion's popu-

lation size and its higher exposure to income and price shocks, the UNDP report highlighted. The report said China is estimated to experience a more moderate increase in the number of people at risk of falling into poverty, from around 115,000 to over 620,000, reflecting small proportional changes applied to a very large population base.

Iran's fresh threat to US: 'If war continues, IRGC will use military power that enemy has no idea about'

Iran has issued a sharp warning to the United States, signalling a possible escalation in the ongoing conflict and hinting at undisclosed military capabilities that could be deployed if hostilities continue. The statement comes amid rising tensions in the region following failed diplomatic efforts and fresh military moves in key strategic waters. Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) said it has not yet deployed its full military strength. IRGC spokesperson Hossein Mohebbi warned that if the war continues, Iran will reveal capabilities that its adversaries are not prepared for. "We have not yet used our capabilities, and if the war continues, we will unveil capabilities that the enemy has no idea about," Mohebbi said. He indicated that the country has so far held back significant elements of its military power, suggesting a potential shift in strategy if the conflict intensifies further. Military preparedness highlighted Iran's Defence Ministry



said the country is fully equipped to sustain prolonged operations. Spokesperson Reza Taleini stated that Iran has sufficient missiles, drones, weapons, and ammunition to continue both offensive and defensive actions. He added that Iran's military capabilities are steadily increasing, reinforcing its readiness for any future confrontation. Strait of Hormuz row deepens Iran also criticised the United States over its reported move to impose a blockade in the Strait of Hormuz. Foreign

Ministry spokesperson Esmail Baghaei called the move harmful to the global economy, disrupting international trade. The Strait of Hormuz is a critical global oil route, and any disruption there could have far-reaching economic consequences. Talks fail, tensions rise The latest escalation follows unsuccessful talks between Iran and the United States held in Islamabad over the weekend. The discussions aimed at reducing tensions but ended without any agreement. The talks came shortly after a ceasefire was

announced last week between Iran, the United States, and Israel, following over a month of conflict. Trump's blockade threat Soon after the failed negotiations, the US military announced a blockade of Iranian ports and coastal areas. It said only ships travelling between non-Iranian ports would be allowed to pass through the Strait of Hormuz. US President Donald Trump also issued a strong warning, saying American forces would act against any Iranian vessel approaching the blockade zone. "Iran's Navy is lying at the bottom of the sea, completely obliterated — 158 ships. What we have not hit are their small number of, what they call, 'fast attack ships,' because we did not consider them much of a threat," Trump said. "Warning: If any of these ships come anywhere close to our BLOCKADE, they will be immediately ELIMINATED, using the same system of kill that we use against the drug dealers on boats at Sea," Trump added.

"The reason for this is the fact that I heard you picked up an extra \$11,000 ... because the tax bill was so big, the refund was the biggest you've ever had," Trump said as he received the order, in a video shared by the White House. He added, "We should call it the 'great big beautiful tax cut bill,' because it's tremendous amounts of money." The delivery person, later identified as Sharon Simmons from Arkansas, was welcomed into the Oval Office as Trump spoke about the benefits of his proposed policy. When asked if the White House was known for tipping well, Simmons replied,

"Yes, very," as Trump pulled out cash from his pocket and handed it to her. The moment was designed to draw attention to a provision under the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," which allows tip earners to deduct up to \$25,000 in income from 2025 through 2028. Consulate hints at naval readiness, counters 'finished navy' claim The consulate referred specifically to Iran's fast missile boats, suggesting they remain operational and prepared. In a post on X, it said, "Hormuz- 'Red bees of the Persian Gulf' yeah, the fast missile boats are warming up. Funny how Trump kept claiming Iran's navy was 'finished'... now they're about to find



out how a swarm can pin you down real quick. Abhi toh sirf trailer hai, picture abhi baaki hai." Trump says Iran 'wants a deal very badly' The remarks from the consulate came hours after Trump indicated that Iran had reached out for negotiations. Speaking earlier in the day, he credited his team, including US Vice President JD Vance, son-in-law Jared Kushner and Special Envoy Steve Witkoff, for ongoing engagement with Tehran. "Well, he's done a good job, and Steve and Jared, they've all done a

very good job. And I can tell you that we've been called by the other side; they'd like to make a deal very badly. Very badly," Trump said. "Iran will not have a nuclear weapon," Trump reiterates. Trump also stressed that any agreement would hinge on Iran giving up nuclear ambitions. "It was over nuclear, very similar, yeah. Very good, I guess you're listening. It's over the fact that they will never have a nuclear weapon. Iran, you mark it down, Iran will not have a nuclear weapon. And we agreed to a lot of things, but they didn't agree to that. And I think they will agree to it, I'm almost sure of it. In fact, I am sure of it. If they don't agree, there's no deal; there'll never be a deal. Iran will not have a nuclear weapon and we're going to get the hostages back. We'll get it back either way; we'll get it back from them or we'll take it," he added.

'Israel is at war with Hezbollah, not Lebanon': US sets tone as Rubio joins talks today

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio will take part in talks between Israel and Lebanon in Washington on Tuesday (local time), as diplomatic efforts gather pace to stabilise the volatile northern frontier. The discussions, to be held at the US State Department, come at a time when hostilities remain unresolved on the ground. The focus, according to American officials, is to push forward dialogue that could ensure long-term security along Israel's northern border while backing Lebanon's push to reclaim full sovereignty. The US delegation will include Ambassador to Lebanon Michel Issa and State Department counsellor Michael Needham, CNN reported. Israel and Lebanon will be represented by their ambassadors, Yechiel Leiter and Nada Hamadeh. A US State Department official said the engagement is part of an ongoing diplomatic process. "This conversation will scope the ongoing

dialogue about how to ensure the long-term security of Israel's northern border and to support the Government of Lebanon's determination to reclaim full sovereignty over its territory and political life," the official said. The official stressed that Washington views the conflict as one between Israel and Hezbollah, not Lebanon as a state, signalling room for continued dialogue between the neighbouring countries. "Israel is at war with Hezbollah, not Lebanon, so there is no reason the two neighbours should not be talking," the official added. Netanyahu signals conditional peace even as operations continue The renewed talks follow recent remarks by Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who said Israel is open to a "real" and lasting peace agreement with Lebanon, even as military operations continue against what he described as Iran-backed forces.

In a post on X, Netanyahu said, "Under my leadership, Israel will continue to fight against Iran's terrorist regime and its proxies, in contrast to Erdogan, who aids them and even slaughters his Kurdish citizens." Reports by Al Jazeera indicate Israel has agreed to begin formal negotiations with Lebanon after weeks of cross-border clashes and a ground incursion into parts of Lebanese territory. In a video address, Netanyahu reiterated that any peace deal must guarantee long-term security and involve the dismantling of Hezbollah's military capabilities. Iran flags ceasefire concerns, maintains contact with Beirut Meanwhile, Iran has remained engaged with Lebanon amid the fragile situation. According to Iran's Fars news agency, Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmail Baghaei said Tehran has been in constant touch with Beirut to ensure ceasefire commitments are honoured.

Concerns about consistency, especially during critical moments, remain. Chennai's home advantage is evident in their commanding head-to-head record. However, this season's slightly faster surface at Chepauk, combined with KKR's spin prowess through Sunil Narine and Varun Chakaravathy, offers the visitors hope they might change the outcome. Winning the toss, KKR captain Ajinkya Rahane said, "I think the last game was really good for us. Unfortunately, the result didn't go our way. But I thought the kind of cricket we played, guys are getting that confidence from the last game. It's all about starting fresh. It's important when things are not going your way, it's important to have that belief, stay positive, and have those small, small moments in the T20 format, which is really important. So, now looking forward to this game, we'll start really well

with the ball and then look to chase down the target.

"The kind of knock Mukul played at night was fantastic. I mean, it's going to happen in this format. As I said, it's all about belief. You know, guys are working really hard. For us, what matters is putting in those hard efforts, focusing on the control levels as players, and, you know, having that belief in each and every individual. PCB imposes two-year ban on Muzarabani for ditching PSL for IPL

Lahore, April 14 : The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has taken strict action on Zimbabwe pacer Blessing Muzarabani, imposing a two-year ban, after he ditched Pakistan Super League (PSL) at the last stage to play Indian Premier League (IPL) 2026 for Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR).

The 29-year-old had initially gone unsold at both the IPL and PSL auctions before being signed as a replacement player by Islamabad United, but he ditched the team and opted to play in the IPL, where he was announced as a replacement for Mustafizur Rahman, who had been released by KKR on BCCI instructions amid external developments. KKR confirmed the signing, and Muzarabani joined their squad, arriving ahead of the IPL season that started shortly after the PSL. "Following a thorough disciplinary review, the PCB has announced that Zimbabwean cricketer



Blessing Muzarabani is declared ineligible to participate in the next two (2) editions of the HBL PSL, effective immediately," the PCB said in a statement. "The attempt to move away from such commitments without valid cause is a violation of contractual obligations and the principles of good faith that govern global professional sports," it added. PCB, which had earlier imposed a one-year ban on Corbin Bosch last

year, believes that the sanction was necessary to safeguard the professional environment of the PSL. "The sanction serves as a necessary measure to safeguard the professional environment of the PSL. The PSL remains dedicated to ensuring that the league remains a platform where contractual certainty is respected and where the actions of all players and agents reflect the prestige of the tournament."

Meanwhile, Muzarabani has already played two matches for KKR in IPL 2026. He went wicketless in the first match, but came back strongly against Sunrisers Hyderabad (SRH) and took four wickets. Other than Muzarabani, Spencer Johnson and Dasun Shanaka are two other players who withdrew from their PSL deals to be part of the IPL this season, but their punishment has not been announced at this stage.

abilities. Playing as an impact player will mean he may not have to do a lot of running," McClenaghan told JioStar. Dhoni has missed the first four games for CSK and might miss the fifth one on Tuesday, too. He hasn't been travelling with the team for away matches, nor for their home matches at

Chepauk. He is likely to miss his fifth straight game this Tuesday. "He can just come in, smack the ball into the stands and do his job of finishing in style. His aggressive stroke-making ability will come in handy for Chennai when they are chasing big scores. I think that is a good way to get Dhoni back into the groove. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that the "PM Surya Ghar: SC-ST Solarization" scheme, jointly implemented by the Central and State governments with the aim of welfare of the poor, is continuing successfully in Visakhapatnam district. The cost of setting up a 2 kilowatt (2kwp) solar plant per household is around Rs 1.1 to 1.2 lakh. The central government is providing a subsidy of Rs 60,000, while the state government is taking a loan through NABARD



and bearing the remaining amount, he said, so that the beneficiaries will get it completely free of cost. The 2 kilowatt plant will generate around 240 units of electricity per month. been identified in Visakhapatnam district and plants with a capacity of 7.19 MW have been allotted. A total of Rs 41.35 crore will be spent for this. He said that the life span of these solar plants will be 25 years, which will not only reduce the burden of electricity bills but will also be very beneficial for the environment.
