## Monsoon preparedness: Revanth warns officials of severe action for lapses

**From Our Staff Reporter Hyderabad, June, 14:** In anticipation of the approaching rains, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has mandated that stringent measures be put in place at irrigation projects throughout Telangana. During a review meeting on Sunday at the MCRHRD Bodhi Pavilion in Hyderabad, which focused on the current rainfall and potential natural disasters, the Chief Minister issued crucial directives to officials concerning necessary precautions.

He emphasised that project maintenance must strictly follow the established manual, and engineers involved must adhere to its guidelines without deviation. Furthermore, Chief Engineers (CEs) and Superintending Engineers (SEs) overseeing these projects are required to remain at their local headquarters throughout the monsoon season. The Chief Minister warned that engineers found leaving their project sites without explicit authorisation from higher authorities would face se-



vere repercussions. Additionally, he ordered the immediate release of funds designated for project maintenance and the repair of gates. The Chief Minister stressed the importance of inter-departmental collaboration, stating that officials from the Irrigation department, Metro Water Board, and RWS must work in concert. He also outlined a plan for utilising Rythu Vedikas for urea distribution, assigning responsibility to local Agriculture Officers and involving Revenue department staff in the process. Expressing his displeasure, Revanth Reddy voiced strong concerns regarding the lack of coordination observed between municipal and police officials in affected areas during recent rainfall. He re-

called issuing advance advisories on June 1 following a review meeting, yet noted that officials had not adequately performed their duties during the rainfall on June 9. The Chief Minister also stipulated that operational strategies should be informed by data on waterlogged areas, accident hotspots, and locations prone to traffic congestion. He further directed the Electricity department to be fully prepared and stated that officials failing to be present in the field would be subjected to strict action. "During the rains, traffic personnel, from senior officers to ground staff, must be visible on the roads. I am prepared to personally join them if necessary," he declared. "Any traffic disruptions caused

by the rain will result in severe consequences. Problems arising from human error will not be tolerated, and

any vacancies within the traffic department must be filled without delay," Revanth Reddy said.

## MP Vamsi calls for door-to-door verification during SIR process to save votes

**From Our Staff Reporter Mancherial, June 14:** Peddapalli MP Gaddam Vamsi Krishna has called upon Congress party workers and Booth Level Agents (BLAs) to remain extremely vigilant and protect every eligible voter's name during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls. The MP was addressing an awareness and training meeting organised for key Congress workers, BLAs, and party leaders at

Padmavathi Gardens in Mancherial town on Sunday. Speaking on the occasion, Vamsi Krishna described the right to vote as a sacred democratic right granted by the Indian Constitution. The MP stressed that the purity and accuracy of electoral rolls are essential for strengthening democracy. He instructed BLAs to conduct door-to-door verification of voter lists, ensure that no eligible voter's name is deleted, and

The MP advised all Booth Level Agents to thoroughly understand Forms 6, 7, and 8 and educate the public about them. He warned party cadres to immediately identify and counter any attempts to remove names of eligible voters.

## Schools Reopening

- RTC Buses must operate on all routes aligned with student timings : MD Y. Nagi Reddy

**From Our Staff Reporter Hyderabad, June, 14:** Schools across the state are set to reopen for the 2026-27 academic year from on Monday (June 15) following the summer holidays. In light of this, TGSRTC Managing Director Y. Nagi Reddy has directed officials across all regions to operate an adequate number of school buses on all routes to ensure students face no transportation difficulties. Noting that the new academic year comprises 227 working days, he stated that the transport facilities had been readied to ensure the students reach their destinations safely and on time.

The MD instructed the officials and depot managers across all regions to remain vigilant at the field level and oversee the trans-



port arrangements. He emphasised the need to streamline the bus services to align with the school timings-particularly for the students commuting from rural areas-and mandated the restoration of all previously operated school bus routes.

Nagireddy has directed the field staff to ensure strict adherence to schedules during morning and evening hours so that the students do not have to wait long for buses and to operate the additional bus trips wherever necessary.

## Centre Prioritizes Telangana's Development: Dr. K. Laxman

**From Our Staff Reporter Hyderabad, June, 14:** BJP Rajya Sabha Member and OBC Morcha National President Dr. K. Laxman on Sunday stated that PM Narendra Modi had set a new record in India's history by surpassing former PM Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru's tenure by becoming the only Prime Minister to serve the nation democratically for over 4,399 days. He described it as a remarkable milestone for a leader from an ordinary background to serve as an unblemished public representative for nearly 25 years-comprising 13 years as the Chief Minister of Gujarat and 12 years as the Prime Minister of the country. He highlighted the creation of the world's largest transparent welfare system through the Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-Mobile (JAM) framework, which has enabled the di-

rect transfer of ₹51 lakh crore in Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) funds to beneficiaries' accounts nationwide, eliminating the need for middlemen. Dr. Laxman explained that the Central Government had demonstrated its unwavering commitment to Telangana's development by prioritizing the state and added that this includes providing a tax share of ₹1.18 lakh crore and sanctioning key institutions such as AIIMS Bibinagar, the Sammakka-Sarakka Central Tribal University and the National Turmeric Board.

Speaking at a press conference held at the BJP Telangana state office, Dr. K. Laxman noted that people across the country were celebrating and welcoming the historic record achieved by Prime Minister Modi. He stated that achieving this feat by win-

ning the people's mandate three consecutive times stands as a testament to the strength of Indian democracy. He remarked that the fact that a common person can rise to the highest office-shattering the notion that politics is the exclusive domain of a few families-highlights the greatness of democracy. He criticized the Congress party for its inability to accept this victory while noting that Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's comments reflect their frustration. He lashed out at the Congress leaders for spreading false propaganda against the BJP regarding "seat theft" and "vote theft" in the Rajya Sabha elections. He asserted that it was the Congress party-specifically Jawaharlal Nehru-that committed the very first "seat theft" in Indian poli-



tics. Laxman recalled that shortly after independence, despite a clear majority of support for Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel during the vote to select the country's first Prime Minister, democratic norms and opinions were completely disregarded to hand the position to Nehru. He argued that this marked the Congress party's original act of the seat theft. He remarked that it was ludicrous for a party with such a history to lecture

others on democracy and seat theft today. He emphasized that the people's verdict was supreme in a democracy and alleged that the Congress party was attempting to mislead the public by criticizing a leader elected by the people merely to mask its own failures. He added that their refusal to stop criticizing, even after the Supreme Court upheld the Election Commission's decisions, was a clear sign of their desperation.

## Bhatti slams BRS for belittling Singareni workers' hard work

He expressed anger that BRS leaders were making statements that damage the reputation of Singareni purely for their political interests. To respond to the criticism being made by the opposition against Singareni, Bhatti Vikramarka, along with Minister Sridhar Babu, inspected the Srirampur Open Cast Mine in Mancherial district on Sunday. During the visit, he conducted an open-house inspection and presented the facts before the people. Addressing the gathering, the Deputy Chief Minister stated that any insult to the hard work of

Singareni workers would not be tolerated. He said the open-house inspection was organised to reveal the truth behind the ongoing campaign against Singareni and to distinguish facts from falsehoods. Bhatti Vikramarka alleged that BRS leaders were spreading misinformation for their personal and political interests. He clarified that he was not there to make political statements but only to place facts before the people. He emphasised that the people's government speaks only the truth and that presenting those facts to the public is its responsibility. The Deputy Chief Minister said the growth and success of Singareni are built upon the sweat and tireless efforts of its workers, and anyone who attempts to undermine their dignity would not be



tolerated. He accused BRS leaders of spreading false propaganda against the commitment of Singareni management and the transparent systems followed by the organisation. He asserted that Singareni is not merely a company but an

asset belonging to the people of Telangana. Its resources, systems, and strength come from the people and will always belong to them, Bhatti said. He declared that the government would function with utmost vigilance to ensure that

exploiters and opportunists do not cast their eyes on Singareni. Any attempt to use the institution for political interests would be strongly resisted. Singareni will continue to function with complete transparency, Bhatti Vikramarka said.

# KTR accuses Revanth of sabotaging Meenakshi Natarajan's Rajya Sabha bid

He highlighted that AICC in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan, an honest leader and a trusted aide of Rahul Gandhi, became a target of Revanth Reddy's vindictiveness. Addressing the Khairatabad constituency BRS general body meeting at Telangana Bhavan on Sunday, KT Rama Rao alleged that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy had framed a false case against Natarajan in Hyderabad because she had reported Revanth's corruption, specifically regarding land deals and contracts, to the Congress high command. He further alleged that Revanth Reddy shared details of this fabricated case with the BJP to block Natarajan's nomination for the Rajya Sabha. KT Rama Rao condemned the Chief



Minister for declaring that he considers Hitler his ideal, calling it shameful for a democratic country. The BRS working president described the Congress administration as an utter flop movie, stating that the government has failed completely to implement its promises halfway through its term. He remarked that just as one can tell if a movie is a hit or a flop from its trailer, the Congress government has been a flop since the interval. He criticised the government for failing to fulfill even a single major promise in its first two and a half years. # Development Possible Only Through Centre-State Cooperation: Bandi Sanjay

**Skyline Correspondent Rajanna Sircilla : JUNE - 14:** Rajanna Sircilla, June 14: Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, said that development is possible only when the Central and State governments work together. "Just as clapping is possible only when two hands come together, development can happen only when the Centre and the State cooperate. Telangana suffered greatly because of the foolish governance of the previous government. Since the present State government is cooperating, funds are being released from the Centre. Adequate funds are being provided to improve connectivity from villages to mandals," he said. On Sunday, Bandi Sanjay, along with local MLA and Government Whip Adi Srinivas, laid the foundation stone for the expansion of the Vemulawada-Sirikonda road from Bollaram to Sirikonda in the Vemulawada constituency of Rajanna Sircilla district.



The road will benefit villages such as Mamidipalli, Bavusaipet, Ramannapalli and Govindaraopeta Thanda, besides saving travel time for commuters. Bandi Sanjay stated that over the last seven years, he had brought more than Rs.22,000 crore in Central funds for the development of the Karimnagar Parliamentary Constituency, of which more than Rs.10,000 crore was spent on road infrastructure. Reiterating that Development is possible only when the Central and State governments work together, he said that Politics was limited to the election period and

project to expand and strengthen the road from Vemulawada to Sirikonda (covering approximately 18.21 km) in Rajanna Sircilla district, utilizing the Central Road Infrastructure Fund." The Centre has sanctioned ₹23 crores for these works under the CRIF (Central Road Infrastructure Fund). A six-month deadline has been set for the completion of the project as per the agreement. The scope of the work includes road widening and strengthening, the construction of cement concrete (CC) road sections and pipe culverts, the installation of CC drains within village limits and the implementation of road safety measures. This project will significantly save time for commuters and motorists traveling through the villages of Mamidipalli, Bausaipeta, Ramannapalli, and Govindaraopeta Thanda," he said.

added that once the elections are over, their focus shifts entirely to the development of the constituency for the people who elected them. Choppadandi MLA Medipalli Satyam is extending full cooperation in this matter. We even visited Delhi and met the Union Minister. We are set to commence the work very soon. Vemulawada MLA Adi Srinivas is also extending his cooperation," Sanjay noted. He said that he would strive for the constituency's development by bringing everyone together by rising above partisan politics. "Let us join hands-regardless of whether people voted for the Congress or BRS party -to fulfill their aspirations and transform the Karimnagar parliamentary constituency, including Vemulawada and Sircilla, into a model constituency for the entire nation. ## AP, EESL commit to fast-track India's Largest Smart Street Lighting Project across ULBs



**Vijayawada: June 14**

In a major step towards sustainable urban development and advancing India's climate commitments, the Government of Andhra Pradesh, in collaboration with the Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL), a Ministry of Power undertaking, has resolved to implement the flagship Integrated Lighting Management System (ILMS)-based Smart Street Lighting Project on a fast-track basis across all Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) in the State. The ambitious initiative forms part of the Government of India's Street Lighting National Programme and aims to transform urban infrastructure through the adoption of cutting-edge energy-efficient technologies while providing world-class civic services to citizens. To review the progress of the project, Principal Secretary, Municipal Administration and Urban Development (MA&UD), S. Suresh Kumar, along with Commissioner and Director of Municipal Administration (CDMA) P. Sampath Kumar, held a virtual review meeting with Akhilesh Kumar Dixit, CEO of EESL, and P. Pulla Reddy, CMD of CPDCL and Managing Director of APSEEDCO. During the review, Suresh Kumar emphasized the need to strictly adhere to the timelines set by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu and ensure completion of the project within six months from the date of signing of the agreement so that the benefits of advanced energy-efficiency technologies reach the common people at the earliest. On the occasion, the Principal Secretary released a special report prepared by EESL highlighting the impact of energy-efficiency initiatives across the country.

He recalled that Andhra Pradesh had pioneered the adoption of LED street-lighting technology during the post-Hudhud Cyclone reconstruction phase in Visakhapatnam nearly a decade ago, paving the way for similar initiatives across municipal corporations across the country. He noted that the Chief Minister remains committed to making the ILMS-based Smart Street Lighting Programme a grand success and showcasing Andhra Pradesh as a model for the rest of the country.

CDMA P. Sampath Kumar stated that MA&UD Minister P. Narayana has directed officials to ensure that the project guarantees a minimum energy saving of 30 per cent based on actual measured performance rather than the deemed-savings methodology. Anantapur Urban MLA Daggupati Venkateswara Prasad on Saturday ordered Telugu Desam Party (TDP) coordinators and Booth Level Agents (BLAs) to rigorously participate in the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls across all 285 polling stations in the constituency. 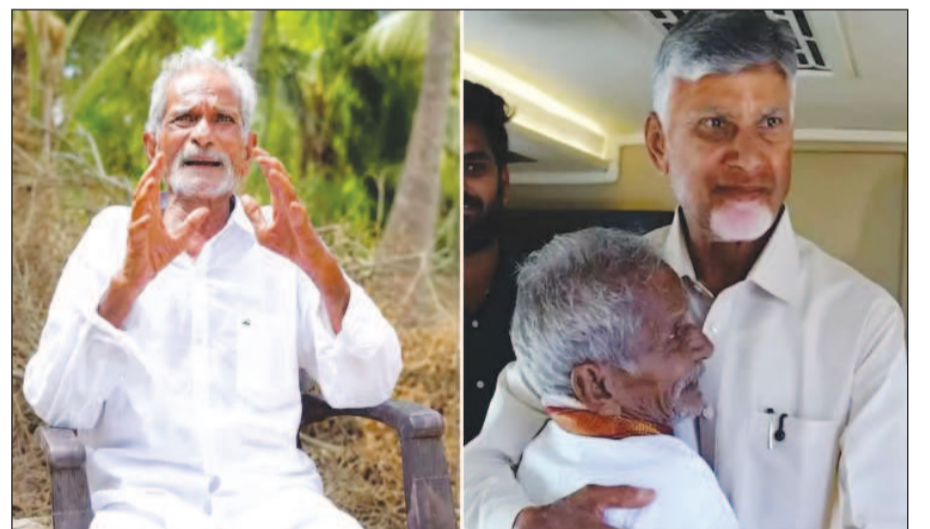

## Borders First

Only days ago, football invited us to believe that the World Cup's greatest gift lies beyond victory itself. The tournament's magic has never resided solely in identifying the strongest team. It has lived in its ability to persuade billions of people, however briefly, that they belong to a shared human spectacle larger than borders and ideologies. Yet the road to the 2026 World Cup has offered an uncomfortable reminder that such moments of togetherness rest on political foundations that can no longer be taken for granted. For decades, the World Cup functioned as a temporary republic of football.

Military dictatorships, Cold War rivalries and diplomatic disputes intruded upon the tournament, but they rarely displaced its central premise: those who qualified to participate would be welcomed into a common space governed by the rules of the game. For one month, the authority of the tournament appeared to transcend the calculations of the state. That assumption is now under strain. The irony is difficult to miss. At a time when the tournament has expanded to include more nations than ever before, the practical barriers to participation appear to be growing. Football's promise of universality has never been broader in theory, yet in practice it is becoming more conditional. A FIFA-appointed referee from Somalia, despite carrying valid documentation and accreditation, found himself denied entry into the host country.

Iran's participation became entangled in exceptional arrangements shaped less by sporting considerations than by security concerns and geopolitics. These episodes are not simply administrative controversies. They reveal the limits of international institutions in an age increasingly defined by resurgent nationalism, hardened borders and the primacy of sovereign discretion. The same tension is visible elsewhere, from disputes over refugee obligations and trade rules to disagreements within climate negotiations and multilateral forums. Institutions designed to foster collective action increasingly find themselves constrained by governments responding to domestic anxieties and political pressures. The World Cup remains one of the few experiences capable of commanding the attention of humanity at once.

It offers a rare demonstration that competition need not destroy community; that fierce loyalties can coexist within commonly accepted rules. If even this global ritual cannot carve out a neutral space insulated from political anxieties, what does that suggest about the prospects for international cooperation elsewhere? The tournament itself will survive. Football is too deeply woven into the emotional lives of billions to disappear. But perhaps what is fading is the comforting belief that the world's biggest sporting event exists above politics. The World Cup once invited us to imagine that, for a few weeks, borders mattered a little less. The events surrounding 2026 suggest a different reality: global institutions endure only so long as nations permit them to do so. The game will go on. The cheering will continue. But the notion that football can transcend the age in which it is played may prove harder than ever to defend.

Three reforms that can change India

As Prime Minister Narendra Modi completes 4,399 days in office, India stands at a defining moment in its modern history.

As Prime Minister Narendra Modi completes 4,399 days in office, India stands at a defining moment in its modern history. Twelve years ago, when he assumed office in May 2014, the nation was burdened by policy paralysis, corruption scandals, administrative inertia, and a pervasive sense of drift. Today, India is the world's fastest-growing major economy, a leading voice of the Global South, a digital innovation powerhouse, and a nation increasingly confident of its place in the world.

Yet, the significance of these 4,399 days lies not merely in what has been achieved. It lies equally in what these achievements have made possible. For, if the first twelve years were about correcting historical distortions and laying the foundations of a New India, the years ahead may well be remembered as the period when India undertook some of the most consequential structural reforms since Independence. The Modi era has already demonstrated an unparalleled ability to convert long-standing national aspirations into reality.

Whether it was the abrogation of Article 370, the implementation of the Goods and Services Tax, the construction of the Ram Mandir after centuries of civilizational yearning, the enactment of the Citizenship Amendment Act, the criminal justice reforms, or the passage of the Women's Reservation Bill, each represented a goal that many considered politically impossi-

ble. Prime Minister Modi has consistently shown that unfinished national agendas do not intimidate him; rather, they inspire him.

That is precisely why it is reasonable to believe that some of India's most important pending reforms may move significantly closer to fruition in the coming months and years. Among them, One Nation, One Election and Delimitation stand out as transformative opportunities that can fundamentally improve the quality of governance in India. For decades, India has remained trapped in a perpetual election cycle. Every few months, one state or another goes to the polls.

Governments, political parties, administrative machinery, and security forces remain continuously engaged in election-related activity. The Model Code of Conduct repeatedly interrupts governance and delays decision-making. Vast public resources are spent on conducting separate elections at different times. The concept of One Nation, One Election seeks to address this inefficiency by synchronising elections to the Lok Sabha and state assemblies. Critics often reduce the debate to politics. In reality, it is fundamentally about governance. Simultaneous elections would allow governments to focus more consistently on development rather than election management.

Administrative resources currently diverted towards repeated electoral exercises could be deployed for governance and public service delivery. Public expenditure on elections would reduce substantially. Most importantly, policy-making could acquire a longer-term perspective instead of being influenced by continuous electoral

calculations. India's rise to becoming a developed nation by 2047 will require unprecedented policy continuity and administrative focus. One Nation, One Election can become a critical instrument in achieving that objective.

Equally significant is the impending process of delimitation. The issue is often misunderstood and therefore politically sensitive. Yet, at its core, delimitation is about preserving the democratic principle of equal representation. Population shifts over several decades have created significant disparities in representation across different regions. The last major delimitation exercise was conducted decades ago, and India today is vastly different from the India of that period. As the world's largest democracy, India cannot indefinitely postpone the task of ensuring that every citizen's vote carries equitable weight in representation.

Delimitation will inevitably involve complex discussions and legitimate concerns. However, democracies cannot remain frozen in time. Institutions must evolve alongside demographic realities. Handled with wisdom, consensusbuilding, and statesmanship, delimitation can strengthen the representative character of Indian democracy and make governance more responsive to contemporary realities. The third major reform whose significance will become increasingly evident is the implementation of the Nari Shakti Vandan Adhinyam, popularly known as the Women's Reservation Bill. Its passage under Prime Minister Modi's leadership was itself historic. Once implemented following the constitutional processes linked to census and



delimitation, it will dramatically reshape India's political landscape by ensuring greater participation of women in legislative decision-making. India's developmental journey has already benefited immensely from women-led initiatives across governance, entrepreneurship, technology, and social transformation. Greater political representation will only accelerate this trend. Taken together, these three reforms have the potential to redefine the architecture of Indian democracy and governance for generations. Sceptics may argue that such predictions are ambitious. But the last twelve years have repeatedly demonstrated that Prime Minister Modi's political philosophy is rooted in persistence. He does not view governance through the lens of electoral cycles alone. He views it through the lens of national transformation. Many of the landmark reforms of the last decade were once dismissed as unattainable. Yet they were achieved because of a leadership that combines conviction with patience and political courage with administrative execution. India's story over the last 4,399 days has been one of expanding possibil-

ities. The country has moved from being perceived as a hesitant power to becoming an aspirational and decisive one. It has strengthened its infrastructure at an unprecedented pace, lifted millions through financial inclusion, pioneered digital public infrastructure, enhanced national security, expanded welfare delivery, and elevated India's global standing.

But perhaps the greatest lesson of the Modi years is that transformative leadership does not stop after achieving difficult goals. It moves relentlessly toward the next frontier. As India marches toward the centenary of Independence in 2047, the next phase of reforms will require the same courage that characterised the previous one. One Nation, One Election. Delimitation. Women's political empowerment.

Governance reforms. Institutional modernisation. These are not merely policy initiatives. They are nation-building instruments. The first 4,399 days transformed India in ways few would have imagined in 2014. The days beyond may prove even more consequential. The biggest transformation, in many ways, is only just beginning.

## Ebola alert.. No fear, but precautions are a must.. self-control is the real protection

Ebola, which is shaking African countries like Congo and Uganda, is now causing concern worldwide. In this context, the Indian government has also issued a key advisory. It has advised that anyone who has traveled to Ebola-affected countries, or transited through them, should go into self-quarantine. Even though no Ebola cases have been confirmed in India so far, experts say precautions are essential. Health experts stress that instead of being careless with a "it won't happen to us" attitude, taking precautions is crucial. They also advise not to believe rumors and to follow government guidelines. By overcoming fear and following precautions, we can escape the threat of Ebola. If you suspect anything, it's best to go to the hospital immediately.

Recently, two people who arrived in Hyderabad from Sudan showed symptoms and were shifted to Gandhi Hospital. With this, Telugu states have also been put on Ebola alert. Experts say identifying Ebola symptoms and going into self-quarantine for about 21 days is advisable. By fighting the Covid-19 virus that created havoc, our country has gained a lot of experience and preparedness. The key is not to panic about Ebola but to take proper precautions. We should follow hygiene measures like washing hands thoroughly four times a day. Non-vegetarians should eat meat only after cooking it well. In this situation, awareness about Ebola is important, and if symptoms appear, consult a doctor immediately. Medical experts say that if needed, it would be good to set up an Ebola emergency ward in every district to provide treatment for the Ebola "Bundibugyo" virus. In this context, we must move forward with the mindset of "No fear - Precautions are a must."

**How to fight Ebola?** Ebola is a severe, life-threatening illness in humans. Three different viruses cause large-scale Ebola outbreaks: Ebola virus, Sudan virus, and Bundibugyo virus. The average fatality rate in Ebola is around 50%. In past outbreaks, fatality rates have varied between 25-90%. Approved vaccines and treatments are available only for one virus, the Ebola virus. For others like Bundibugyo virus, medicines are still in the development stage.

**How is outbreak controlled?** Outbreak control depends on several measures: supportive care for patients, infection prevention and control, disease surveillance, contact tracing, laboratory services, safe and dignified burials, and vaccination if needed.

Ebola disease is caused by viruses belonging to the Orthoebolavirus genus of the Filoviridae family. Six types of Orthoebolavirus have been identified so far. Of these, three are known to cause major outbreaks:

1. Ebola virus (EBOV) – causes Ebola Virus Disease (EVD)
2. Sudan virus (SUDV) – causes Sudan Virus Disease (SVD)
3. Bundibugyo virus (BDBV) – causes Bundibugyo Virus Disease (BVD)

Ebola disease first occurred in 1976 in two simultaneous outbreaks: Sudan virus disease in Nzara, present-day South Sudan, and Bundibugyo virus in Yambuku, present-day Democratic Republic of Congo. The second outbreak happened in a village near the Ebola River, which is how the disease got its name.

Although vaccines and treatments exist for some Ebola viruses, there is no approved vaccine or treatment for SVD or BVD, including today's Bundibugyo virus. Proposed drug products are in development.

**Human-to-human transmission**

Fruit bats of the Pteropodidae family are thought to be natural hosts of Orthoebolavirus. The virus can enter the human population when people come into close contact with the blood, secretions, organs, or other body fluids of infected animals like fruit bats, chimpanzees, gorillas, monkeys, forest antelope, or porcupines that are sick, dead, or found in rainforests. Large

wild bats are the source of Ebola virus. Eating fruits bitten by bats or hunting bats for meat can cause Ebola. This is how it started in Africa.

Medical experts say the virus can spread from person to person through direct contact via broken skin or mucous membranes. With Bundibugyo virus, a person can infect others as long as the virus is present in their blood.

Healthcare workers often get infected while treating Ebola patients. This happens when infection prevention precautions are not strictly followed during close contact with patients. Safe burial practices are also important, as direct contact with the body of someone who died from Bundibugyo virus can spread Ebola.

The incubation period for Bundibugyo virus is 2 to 21 days, depending on a person's immunity.

**Ebola disease symptoms**

Ebola symptoms can appear suddenly: fever, fatigue, weakness, muscle pain, headache, sore throat. These are followed by vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain, rashes, and impaired kidney and liver function. It's very important for healthcare workers to be alert to these symptoms.

Though bleeding is thought to be a common symptom, it's not that frequent. It may occur in advanced stages. Some patients may have internal and external bleeding, including blood in vomit and stool, bleeding from nose and gums. Bleeding can also occur at needle puncture sites.

**Diagnosis**

It's difficult to clinically distinguish Ebola from other infectious diseases like malaria, typhoid fever, shigellosis, meningitis, and other viral hemorrhagic fevers, because early symptoms are similar.

**Treatment**

Over the years, WHO and its partners have developed guidelines and training on how to provide the best possible care to patients and increase their chances of survival. This is called Optimized Supportive Care. It covers other approaches that put the patient on the best



path to recovery.

Raising awareness of risk factors and protective measures people can take is an effective way to reduce human transmission. Several areas should be focused on to reduce risk:

Avoid close physical contact with Ebola patients. To provide rapid care and prevent spread at home, patients should be isolated in designated treatment centers.

People must have full awareness about the disease and how to control its spread.

Outbreak prevention measures include safe and dignified burials conducted with medical team help, identifying and monitoring contacts of infected persons for 21 days, separating healthy people from patients to prevent further spread, and providing care to confirmed cases. Maintaining good hygiene and a clean environment is also crucial.

Infection control in healthcare facilities

Healthcare workers should always take standard precautions when treating patients, regardless of diagnosis. These include basic hand hygiene, respiratory hygiene, use of personal protective equipment to avoid contact with splashes or other infected material, safe injection practices, and safe, dignified burial practices by medical teams.

Healthcare workers treating patients suspected or confirmed to have Ebola should follow additional infection control measures to avoid contact with patients' blood, body fluids, and contaminated surfaces or objects like clothing and bedding.

**Care for survivors**

All who recover, along with their partners and families, should be treated with respect, dignity, and compassion. WHO recommends that recovered patients who test negative for Orthoebolavirus should not be kept in isolation. Survivors may suffer both medical and psychological consequences. WHO encourages affected countries to set up care programs to reduce these effects, support reintegration into society, and include counseling and biological testing.

Especially, there should be surveillance on people coming from abroad. They may get infected during transit at international airports, but symptoms may not appear within hours at the airport. Symptoms may appear after 21 days.

Given current financial difficulties, it's not possible to quarantine everyone coming from abroad for 21 days as a precaution. If someone got infected in the past 21 days without knowing and lived normally without precautions, it can be a major cause of disease spread. Just like we face economic hardship due to price hikes from wars happening far away, in coming days we must stay very alert to such viruses and follow health organization guidelines. Stay away from forest areas with large bats, dilapidated buildings, and bat-infested areas. Personal self-control is health protection.

## Pakistan: 9-year-old Australian girl shot dead by police in case of mistaken identity

New Delhi, Jun 14: In a bizarre incident, a nine-year-old Australian girl of Pakistani origin was killed and her father and brother were left critically injured after police opened indiscriminate fire on their vehicle over suspicion of them being robbers. According to police, the incident took place on June 10 in Chakwal district, about 300 km from Lahore, in Punjab province of Pakistan, PTI reported. The shocking incident has caused significant distress to the Australian-Pakistani community, according to the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). It noted that



assistance is being provided to the victim family. Notably, the Australian-Pakistan family, which included Adeel Ahmed (39), his wife Dr Sidra Khan and their children – daughter Hania, 9, and son Aafan, 10 – came back to Pakistan after per-

forming Hajj pilgrimage in Saudi Arabia last week. Recently, the family was travelling to Ahmed's father-in-law's residence for dinner in a car when they were waylaid by two armed gunmen on a motorcycle. Soon after, he called the

police emergency number, while the incident was communicated to the Crime Control Department (CCD). After arriving at the spot, the CCD personnel mistook the family in the vehicle as robbers and started indiscriminate fire. As the car was riddled with bullets, the incident killed Hania on the spot and Adeel and Aafan were critically injured and shifted to hospital. Dr Sidra remained unhurt in the incident. Police said they have taken a CCD official involved in the firing incident into custody on murder charges and launched a formal investigation against others.

## Hospital in Jaipur successfully performs its first Carotid Body Tumour surgery on a Yemeni woman

New Delhi, Jun 14: A team of ENT and Head and Neck surgeons at the Mahatma Gandhi Hospital here has successfully performed a highly complex surgery for a Carotid Body Tumour (Carotid Body Paraganglioma) on a Yemeni woman. The surgery, the first operation of this sort in any hospital in Rajasthan, was performed by a high-profile team of doctors led by world-renowned ENT and Head surgeon Prof (Dr) Suresh Chandra Sharma, along with Dr Bhinyaram. The procedure was performed on a 64-year-old Yemeni woman, Sabah Omar Mohammed Ba Naga, setting a new benchmark in advanced head and neck surgery.

The surgery, the first operation of this sort in any hospital in Rajasthan, was performed by a high-profile team of doctors led by world-renowned ENT and Head surgeon Prof (Dr) Suresh Chandra Sharma, along with Dr Bhinyaram. The procedure was performed on a 64-year-old Yemeni woman, Sabah Omar Mohammed Ba Naga, setting a new benchmark in advanced head and neck surgery.

Regarding the case history, Dr Bhinyaram said Ba Naga had been suffering from swelling and pain in her neck for a long time. The treatment for her condition was not available in Yemen.

Through an internet search, she learned that Prof (Dr) Suresh Chandra Sharma, one of the world's most experienced surgeons in Carotid Body Tumour surgery, was practising at Mahatma Gandhi

Hospital.

Following an online consultation, she travelled to Jaipur with her daughter, Kauthar, for treatment. Detailed investigations revealed bilateral carotid body paragangliomas along with a skull base tumour, making the condition extremely challenging. The tumour was in an advanced stage and had encased the carotid artery almost 360 degrees. Such cases carry a very high surgical risk, as even a minor error can result in life-threatening haemorrhage. However, equipped with the expertise and rich experience of the surgical team, the surgery achieved complete success.

Dr Bhinyaram explained that surgeries of this nature can be performed only at a few highly specialised medical centres in the country. Mahatma Gandhi Hospital is also providing advanced treatment for head and neck cancers and other complex conditions using modern robotic surgical techniques. Apart from the medical challenges, he said issues related to visa extensions, accommodation, and language interpretation were also addressed during the patient's treatment.

These challenges were resolved in a timely manner, ensuring uninterrupted care.



The contribution of the Department of Anaesthesiology was also crucial to the success of the surgery. The anaesthesia team included Dr Nikhil Soni, Dr Avnish Bhardwaj, Dr Vijay Mathur, and Dr Narendra Kumar. Expressing their gratitude after the successful treatment, Ba Naga and her daughter appreciated the high-quality medical care, professionalism, and compassionate support provided by Mahatma Gandhi Hospital.

Ba Naga was operated upon on June 2. After a post-surgery follow-up drill and the removal of stitches, she was allowed to go back home a couple of days ago. Accordingly, the mother and daughter are expected to return to Yemen shortly.

tinue to run," he asserted. He highlighted that the world looked at India as a technology adopter a decade back, however, the country is now emerging as a technology provider.

"India is innovating for a sustainable future. India is innovating for the world," Prime Minister Modi said and noted that innovation is in the country's DNA. He added, "India has emerged not as a consumer of solutions but as a contributor to solutions in the world." Also, he mentioned that India and France share a "special partnership" that has "connection, conviction, innovation, inspiration and shared vision"

## White House confirms Modi-Trump meeting in France on G7 Summit sidelines

New Delhi, Jun 14: Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US President Donald Trump will hold a bilateral meeting in France on the sidelines of the G7 Summit, the White House confirmed on Saturday.

The meeting between the two leaders is expected on Wednesday. They are likely to discuss several issues of mutual interests, including the India-US trade agreement. Meanwhile, PM Modi has arrived in Nice, France for his official State visit at the invitation of French President Emmanuel "I have just landed in Nice. Beyond Nice, this visit to France includes programmes in Evian and Paris. It will be marked by bilateral and multilateral meetings, aimed at strengthening India's bonds of friendship with its key development partners," Prime Minister Modi said on X. "I look forward to meeting

President Macron tomorrow and being present at 'Bharat Innovates'," he added.

Prime Minister Modi will hold bilateral talks with French President Macron in Nice on June 14, during which the two leaders will review the full spectrum of their bilateral relationship.

According to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), the two leaders will also jointly inaugurate the 'Bharat Innovates' event, which will bring together leading startups and venture capital funds from India, France and several other countries.



"Being held during the 'India-France Year of Innovation', this signature event reinforces the vibrant innovation partnership that exists between the two countries," MEA had noted.

After concluding his France visit, Modi will be headed to Slovakia. He will be the first Indian PM to visit the country since its independence in 1993.

## Iran agrees to not produce or acquire nuclear weapons under MoU, claims report; Tehran yet to confirm signing date

New Delhi, Jun 14: The Islamic Republic of Iran has reportedly agreed to not produce a nuclear weapon or acquire one under the 14-point memorandum of understanding (MoU) expected to be signed digitally on Sunday. According to news agency Reuters, the MoU covers key sticking points, including Tehran's nuclear programme, reopening of Strait of Hormuz and sanctions relief. While US President Donald Trump has said that the deal will be signed on Sunday, Iran is yet to confirm the signing date as it continues to review the final draft of the MoU. However, some reports suggested the deal would indeed be signed on Sunday but digitally as both countries will continue to negotiate a final agreement over the next 60 days. What are the reported terms of the US-Iran MoU? According to the Reuters report, under the MoU, Iran will not produce or acquire nuclear



weapons. However, the Islamic Republic will maintain its current nuclear programme until a final agreement is negotiated during the 60-day period. While maintaining its nuclear programme, Tehran won't be allowed to enrich uranium and expand nuclear facilities. The already enriched uranium will be diluted inside Iran and both sides

will discuss a joint mechanism within the 60-day negotiation period. The Strait of Hormuz will be reopened for commercial vessels and the US will lift its blockade of Iranian ports. According to Iranian state media, the US will release USD 24 billion in frozen funds during a 60-day final negotiation period.

The deceased person has been identified as Nishanth Uirthanathan. In a post on X, the Embassy said it was in touch with the family members of Uirthanathan, crew members of the vessel and other authorities.

"The Embassy remains in close touch with family members of the Indian national Mr. Nishanth Uirthanathan who unfortunately lost his life due to medical conditions, crew members of the vessel and concerned authorities. Efforts are underway to facilitate the earliest possible disembarkation and

repatriation of his mortal remains," it wrote. On Saturday, the Indian Embassy in Oman informed that it was in touch with the ship management company and other authorities.

"An Indian national Mr. Nishanth Uirthanathan passed away due to medical complications. His mortal remains are currently onboard MT Celestial at Duqm Port," it wrote. "The Embassy has been in continuous contact with the ship management company and is coordinating closely with all concerned stakeholders. Necessary arrangements

are being made for the early repatriation of the mortal remains to India. Our deepest condolences to the bereaved family during this difficult time," the post added. This comes after three Indian crew members died after an attack was reported on a commercial vessel, 'Settebello', off the coast of Oman earlier this week.

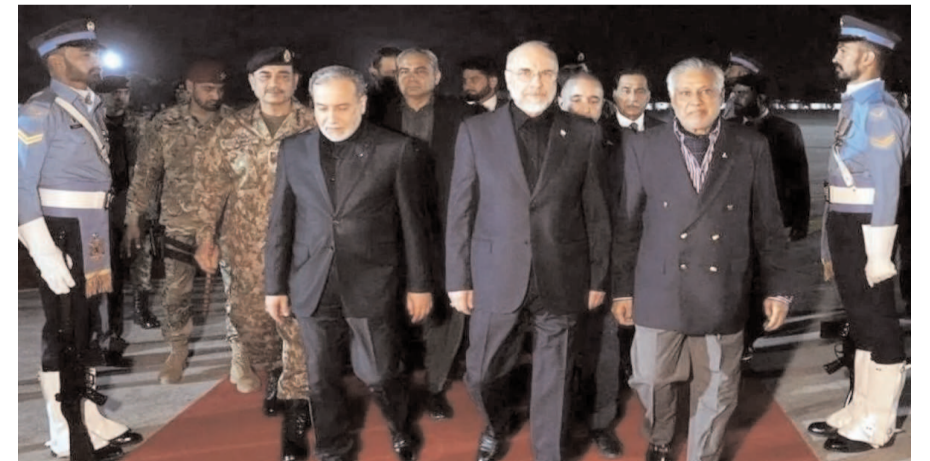


## 'Peace deal with US likely in coming days but not on Sunday': Iran rejects Pak PM's claim

New Delhi, Jun 14: Hours after Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif claimed that the peace deal between the United States and Islamic Republic of Iran could be signed in the next 24 hours, Tehran on Saturday said that the exact date of signing has not yet been decided.

"We will have to wait and see about the exact date of the signing of the memorandum of understanding, although it will not be tomorrow," Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmail Baghaei said. He, however, added that it is possible the peace deal could be signed in the coming days.

"The possibility of this happening in the coming days cannot be ruled out. However, due to the hesitation of the other side, we must be cautious in making any comments about this process," he added. His remarks came after the Pakistani PM said that



the peace deal is closer than ever and signing is expected in the next 24 hours. "We are closer to a peace deal than ever before. With finalisation expected in the next 24 hours, Pakistan is preparing for the electronic signing of the peace deal immediately after, followed by technical-level talks next week," the Pakistani PM said. What are the terms of the US-Iran peace deal? While neither side has formally released the terms

of the agreement, reports claimed it is the 14-point memorandum of understanding (MoU) proposed by the US but changes have been made in its language. Under the framework, the war will stop on all fronts, including Lebanon, for 60 days to start negotiations on Iran's nuclear programme. Iran would open the Strait of Hormuz and the United States would lift the naval blockade of Iranian ports in the Persian Gulf.

During the 60-day period, the US, Iran and other countries in the region are also expected to discuss the management of the Strait of Hormuz. Once these issues are resolved, especially the nuclear one, a signing ceremony would take place in Geneva, Switzerland. Discussions during the next phase will also include the lifting of American sanctions, including on Iran's oil sales and international banking transactions.

The special appearances by Rahul Ravindran and Nivetha Pethuraj work nicely. The cameos towards the end came as a pleasant surprise.

Cinematography by Ankur S is decent. Though a bit of naturality is missing in the village portions, the visuals inside the mines and

**Symbol Analogies:** Similar to letter analogies, symbol analogies involve identifying patterns among symbols and extending them to solve the analogy.

**Types of Reasoning Questions in Competitive Exams Tips to solve Analogy Questions**

Here are some tips that will help you to solve different analogy questions for competitive-based exams. These are:

The only way to make improvements in verbal analogies is by practising. So keep on practicing different sets of questions every day.

Familiarize yourself with the test format to know your strengths and weaknesses.

In the question, try to determine or identify the relationship. Translate analogies into phrases. Read analogy issues as sentences, even if they are not written that way.

# GVMC to develop 60 Theme Parks Across Visakhapatnam

By Skyline Staff Reporter Visakhapatnam, June 14 Aimed at making Visakhapatnam a model city for greenery, healthy lifestyle, and eco-friendly transportation, the Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) is taking up several innovative programmes. According to a press note issued by GVMC Commissioner Ketan Garg, priority is being given to environmental protection, social participation and development of heritage sites in addition to enhancing the physical and mental health of the people.

As a part of the initiative, 60 theme parks, cycling tracks and heritage walking tracks are being developed in the city. There are currently a total of 174 parks in all zones under the GVMC, of which 139 are colony parks covering an area of 151 acres. Out of these, 60 parks that need further development have been identified and divided into six packages and will be developed as special theme parks at an estimated cost of Rs. 10.97 crore. Each park will have a special theme, i.e., a nature theme, an adventure theme, a fitness theme, a

children's theme, and other special themes. These theme parks will also have beautiful gardens, flower beds, walking and jogging tracks, theme-based children's play equipment, open gyms, yoga zones, cultural and educational exhibitions, sculptures, murals, information boards, fountains, water features, RCC benches, seating and rest areas, CCTV surveillance, solar-powered lighting, drinking water facilities, toilets, electric lamps, and water supply facilities for plants. These theme parks will also be developed with measures such as



rainwater conservation, use of recycled material, local and low-water plants, and environmental protection. With the objectives of protecting public health, controlling pollution and saving energy, it has been decided to observe every Monday as a 'Cycling Day' voluntarily within the GVMC limits. An official advisory has been issued to all Heads of Departments (HODs) and Zonal Commissioners, and offi-

cers and employees have been advised to pedal to their offices. According to the commissioner, people should also voluntarily follow this programme, as cycling improves heart health, increases mental alertness, reduces obesity, controls pollution and saves energy. For the health protection of the people of Visakhapatnam, a pleasant atmosphere and pollution control, a beachfront cycle track near Sagarnagar Beach, 10 feet wide and 700 metres long, at a cost of about Rs. 2 crore, has been proposed

for the development of a city cycle track, as well as a cycling track in the vicinity of the Arilova Skill Development Centre, 2.70 metres wide and 5.20 kilometres long, with a cost of about Rs. 3 crore, and a design has been made to promote cycling culture in the city. In order to bring the heritage wealth of Visakhapatnam closer to the people, the GVMC has completed the development of the Heritage Walking Track in the South Zone of Visakhapatnam from Purna Market to One Town Police Station,

measuring 1.20 km in length and 7.5 feet in width at a cost of Rs. 42 lakh. For the convenience of heritage walkers, signboards, directional boards along the entire route of the track, and 'No Parking' boards will be put up with information material about the importance of heritage places and will be made available to the people soon. The commissioner has called upon all the officials, employees and the public to adopt a healthy lifestyle and be a part of building a healthy Vizag.

Ram has alleged that the coalition government is celebrating victories like Emperor Nero played the flute while the city of Rome was burning. Krishna Nagu will be paid Rs. 200.31 9, 2.25, 47.70 lakhs, K. Prabhakar Rao Rs. 135.96, G. Bhanu Kumar Rs. 44.87, and Gold Kumar Rs. 79.49 lakhs. Out of these, only two families will receive compensation of more than Rs. 1 crore. On the other hand, he said that there is no information about the total compensation that will be given to the families of temporary workers. In any case, Ram said that justice needs to be done to the affected families. He demanded that the government should pay compensation of Rs. 1 crore each to the permanent employees who lost their lives in the accident and to the temporary workers. Where is Industries Minister T.G. Bharat? Although it is natural for



Pawan Kalyan to come as Deputy Chief Minister after the horrific accident at the Visakhapatnam Steel Plant, he said that there was no need for Nara Lokesh to come. He criticized that Nara Lokesh, as the Minister of All Departments, is trying to dominate all matters. - Commitment to Develop a 'Green Nagpur' Through Plantation of 2.5 Million Trees: Union Minister Nitin Gadkari  
- Union Minister addresses press conference in Nagpur to mark 12 years of the Central Government



**Nagpur (PIB):** Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Shri Nitin Gadkari has reiterated his commitment to transform Nagpur into a green city through the plantation of 2.5 million trees across the city and district. Under the "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" campaign, saplings measuring 2 to 3 metres in height will be provided to schools, universities, voluntary

organisations, political parties, and other stakeholders to undertake large-scale plantation and conservation activities, he said. Shri Gadkari was addressing a press conference in Nagpur to highlight the achievements and developmental initiatives undertaken during the last 12 years of the Central Government. Maharashtra Revenue Minister and Guardian Minister

of Nagpur District Shri Chandrashekhar Bawankule, along with local public representatives, were present on the occasion.

The Union Minister informed that, with the support of the Revenue and Forest Departments and through the Remote Sensing Centre located in Nagpur, mapping of all districts and talukas in

Maharashtra will be undertaken. Information regarding districts that have carried out extensive plantation activities will be documented, and such districts will be recognised for their contribution. Reviewing various welfare initiatives of the Central Government, Shri Gadkari stated that more than 58 crore bank accounts have been opened under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana during the last 12 years. Ayushman Bharat has benefited 60 crore citizens, while 11 crore LPG connections have been provided under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana. He further noted that 11 crore farmers are receiving annual financial assistance under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme. Highlighting employment generation initiatives, Shri Gadkari said that loans worth approximately 235 lakh crore have been disbursed to 57 crore beneficiaries under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, benefiting small entrepreneurs and street vendors. Under the Startup India initiative, 1.6 lakh startups and 118

unicorns have emerged. Additionally, around 5 crore youth have received skill training under the Skill India Mission over the past 12 years. Speaking about development projects in Nagpur, Shri Gadkari said that modernisation of major city markets is underway, including the Cotton Market Redevelopment Project (Phase I and II), Itwari Market, Dahi Market, Orange Market Development Project, Netaji Market Development Project, Kamal Chowk Commercial Complex, Budhwari Market, Mahal Redevelopment Project, and Sakkardara Budhwari Market Redevelopment Project. Other important projects being implemented include the Agro Convention Centre at Dabha, Sokta Bhavan Redevelopment Project, Mor Bhavan Redevelopment Project, and Ganeshpeth Bus Stand Redevelopment Project. He further informed that work on Phase II of the Nagpur Metro is progressing, while the Detailed Project Report (DPR) for Phase III has already

been prepared. The Union Minister also highlighted several key infrastructure and institutional projects in Nagpur, including the Oxygen Park, Bird Park, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Indian Institute of Management (IIM), National Law University, Indian Institute of Information Technology (IIIT), Employees' State Insurance Hospital at Butibori, Buddhist Circuit Project, Deekshabhoomi Redevelopment Project, Sports Authority of India Centre, and the Mother Dairy Project. Emphasising employment generation alongside infrastructure development, Shri Gadkari stated that the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has initiated the establishment of Driving Training Centres across the country. Under the policy announced in January 2025, a total of 1,600 centres are proposed to be established nationwide. Of these, 24 centres are already operational, while 112 centres are in the pipeline. So far, around 10 lakh people have received training through these facilities.

locks. 6:30 AM: Search begins, from second floor to terrace, lasting 90 minutes. Outcome? Seizure report says: NIL. No evidence. No wrongdoing. NOTHING. Just political vendetta, intimidation and mental torture. Operation Lotus is targeting every leader who refuses to surrender to the BJP's diktat. Disgraceful attack on an opposition leader. VINDICTIVE, CONNING, scumbag LOW LIFE tactics. SHAME." The developments come amid growing political turmoil in the state, with an FIR reportedly being lodged against former Chief Minister and TMC chief Mamata Banerjee over alleged communal remarks made during a protest against the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise. According to allegations, Banerjee had told members of a minority community that their safety depended on her leadership and urged them not to be influenced by what she termed the BJP's "misleading" statements.

## Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma Announces End To Routine Aadhaar Issuance For Adults Above 18 To Curb Illegal Immigration

Guwahati: In a significant move aimed at curbing illegal immigration, the Assam Cabinet has decided to stop the routine issuance of Aadhaar cards to individuals above the age of 18. Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma announced the decision on Saturday, saying the measure is intended to prevent illegal immigrants from obtaining the identity document. Addressing a press conference after chairing a Cabinet meeting, Sarma said adults seeking Aadhaar enrolment will now have to undergo an additional layer of scrutiny. In exceptional cases, district commissioners will have to send proposals to the state government seeking approval before Aadhaar cards can be issued. In national interest, Assam has decided to ban issuance of Aadhaar cards to all adults above 18 years so that no illegal can legitimise themselves. The ST and Tea Garden community will get an extension till 31 March 2027 to enrol themselves under Aadhaar.

The Chief Minister said Aadhaar enrolment in Assam has reached saturation levels, with coverage crossing 100 per cent in some districts. According to him, the development has raised concerns over the identities of those obtaining additional Aadhaar cards. "We must ascertain who these people are who are taking the additional

Aadhaar cards. The step is being taken to ensure that no illegal Bangladeshi obtains an Aadhaar card," Sarma said.

The decision reflects the state government's continuing focus on addressing concerns related to illegal immigration from neighbouring Bangladesh. The administration has repeatedly maintained that stricter verification measures are necessary to safeguard official identity systems from misuse.

Despite the new restrictions, certain sections of society will continue to be eligible for Aadhaar enrolment. Sarma said members of the tea garden community, Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes and persons with disabilities will continue to receive Aadhaar cards, as many individuals in these groups are yet to be enrolled. However, the exemption will only remain in force until March 31, 2027. "From April 1, 2027, people from these communities above the age of 18 will also stop receiving Aadhaar cards," the Chief Minister said. Aadhaar enrolment for individuals below the age of 18 will continue without any change.

Sarma had earlier indicated that the state government would adopt a strict approach towards Aadhaar issuance and make it difficult for illegal immigrants to obtain the document. Last year, he had said the gov-



ernment was considering tighter rules for Aadhaar enrolment among adults as part of efforts to curb illegal immigration.

### Cabinet Clears Rural Employment Framework

The Cabinet also approved the implementation framework for the VB-G RAM G Act in Assam. The scheme will come into effect from July 1. Sarma said Rs 2,000 crore has been allocated for the initiative, under which 125 man-days of direct wage employment will be provided. Apart from generating employment, the government plans to focus on creating durable assets through the programme. The Chief Minister said asset creation would be given importance alongside employment generation under the new law.

### Satellite Cities Authority Approved

In another key decision, the Cabinet approved the establishment of the Guwahati Satellite Cities Development Authority (GSCDA). The authority will be responsible for planning, financing and developing satellite cities in and around Guwahati. The proposed authority will function within the jurisdiction of the Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority. The Cabinet also decided that approval from the state Cabinet will now be mandatory before issuing No Objection Certificates to officers of All India Services, including IAS officers, seeking central or inter-state deputation. Meanwhile, Sarma announced that the budget session of the Assam Legislative Assembly will begin on July 6. The date for the presentation of the state budget will be announced separately.

The case alleges that Vaithilingam accepted a Rs.27.9 crore bribe from Shriram Properties and Infrastructure Pvt Ltd (now Gateway Office Parks) during his tenure as Housing and CMDA Minister in the 2011-2016 AIADMK gov.



Chennai: A week after stating it would close a corruption case against former AIADMK minister R Vaithilingam, the Tamil Nadu government's vigilance department on Friday told a Chennai sessions court it would re-investigate the charges against him. A senior official of the Directorate of Vigilance and Anti-Corruption (DVAC) credited the Free Press Journal article published on June 9 for alerting the government about the closure report. The FPJ exclusive highlighted how the MK

Stalin-led DMK government had decided to drop the case a month after he joined DMK on January 21. He is among the 59 DMK candidates who won in the 2026 assembly polls. Now an MLA from Orathanadu in Thanjavur district, he was the housing and Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority (CMDA) minister in the 2011-16 AIADMK regime, during which he was alleged to have taken a bribe of ₹27.9 crore from Shriram Properties and Infrastructure Private Ltd (now Gateway Office Parks) to facilitate planning permissions for a project near Chennai.

The bribe was allegedly routed through Shriram group firm Bharat Coal and Chemicals Ltd (BCCL) to Muthammal Estates Pvt Ltd, a firm run by Vaithilingam's sons Prabu and Shanmugaprabu. All these parties are also named as accused in the case. DVAC registered the case against Vaithilingam, his sons and officials of the private firm in September 2024 based on a complaint filed by NGO Arappor Iyakkam. Though the closure report was filed in court on February 25, DVAC confirmed the closure on June 4, four weeks after the new TVK government under CM Jo-

seph Vijay took office. Activists questioned whether the decision was taken with the concurrence of Vijay or the new DVAC director, A Arun IPS, who took charge on May 25. TVK supporters shared the FPJ report on social media and urged Vijay to reverse the decision, noting that the party had aggressively positioned DMK as their main political opponent before the elections. Official sources indicated that the establishment was unaware of the June 4 decision. "After the FPJ report, we decided to reverse the decision," an official said.

## Fake Army Brigadier Arrested In UP: 21-Year-Old Caught With Forged ID And Dummy NSG Commandos

Shahjahanpur: A shocking case has come to light from Uttar Pradesh's Shahjahanpur. Army personnel detained a 21-year-old man for allegedly impersonating a Brigadier in the Indian Army. The accused has been identified as Aryan Verma. He was caught during a sting operation at the Shaheed Museum after reportedly spending months posing as a high-ranking officer while travelling through Shahjahanpur and nearby areas in full military attire. Army authorities as well as intelligence agencies had been keeping Verma under strict surveillance after get-

ting information regarding his suspicious movement in a Brigadier's ceremonial uniform since April. In order to track Verma's movement precisely, officials decided to make use of a trap. Verma was asked to give a motivational speech to aspirants for defence jobs ahead of their recruitment exams. The venue selected for the supposed event was Shaheed Memorial, located inside the Shahjahanpur cantonment.

The imposter arrived at the venue on Friday morning dressed as a Brigadier. He was travelling in an SUV bearing military stars and flags associated with se-



nior officers, officials said. Army personnel detained him immediately upon his arrival. During the operation, officials also recovered a fake government identity card from his driver. He also kept 2 fake NSG commandos with him. Officials also recovered an

identity card purportedly bearing the seal of the dean of the Armed Forces Medical College, which investigators suspect is forged. An Army regimental cane and a dummy pistol were also seized from his possession, reported Hindustan Times.

He added that MLA Aadi Srinivas holding a press conference within hours of the event was proof of this concern. Lakshminarsimha Rao alleged that Aadi Srinivas lacks proper understanding of irrigation projects and said it was the BRS government that completed several irrigation projects across the state and made them available



to farmers. He also claimed that despite the presence of motors at the Kalikota Suramma Project, water supply is not being managed properly.

Concluding his remarks, he said he wished that Aadi Srinivas would get a ministerial berth, but advised him to stop making misleading statements and instead focus on bringing funds for the development of

Vemulawada. He reiterated that the Congress government is confined to press conferences, whereas the foundation for Vemulawada's development was laid by the BRS government.
