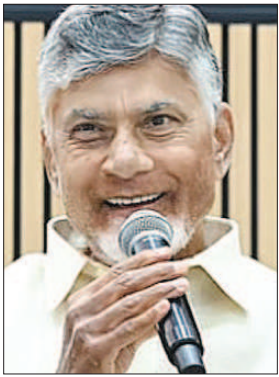
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Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu to launch construction works of Kadapa Steel Plant on July 3

Kadapa, July 2: Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu will launch the construction works of JSW Rayalaseema Integrated Steel Plant at Sunnapurallapalli and Peddadanluru villages in YSR Kadapa district on July 3, marking a defining milestone in Rayalaseema's industrial journey. The commencement of construction transforms a long-pending aspiration into reality and reaffirms the State Government's commitment to making Rayalaseema a major manufacturing and green industrial hub. The integrated steel plant will be developed by JSW Andhra Pradesh Steel Limited in two phases over 1,100 acres with a



total investment of Rs 16,350 crore. Phase I will involve an investment of Rs 4,500 crore, while Phase II will bring an additional Rs 11,850 crore, taking the plant's capacity to 2 million tonnes per annum (MTPA). Commercial production is targeted to commence by March 2028. The project was (Contd. on pg.2)

Tirupati, July 02: The Central Government's ambitious scheme VBG Ramji has started from AP and has been implemented across the country. Railway Kodur in Tirupati district was the venue for this historic event. Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan launched the 'Vikasith Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar Ajeevika Mission' scheme from AP. With this, this scheme has been implemented across the country. The three leaders formally launched three works proposed at a cost of Rs. 4.55 lakh in Mukkavaripalli village. Social rainwater harvesting kunta, magic drain and plantation programs were initially undertaken under the VBG



Ramji Mission. The Union Minister, CM and Deputy CM jointly handed over VBG Ramji job cards to the local beneficiaries under this scheme. Union Ministers Pemmasani Chandrasekhar and Kamlesh Paswan launched the VBG Ramji motivational song. Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan

released an information booklet and compendium of articles under this scheme. The leaders launched the Vikasit Bharat Guarantee for Employment and Livelihood Mission portal. Later, Chief Minister Chandrababu said.. "It is historic that the VBG Ramji scheme started from the

Railway Kodur constituency in AP and was implemented across the country. In the past, NREGA started from the Rayalaseema region. Now the VBG Ramji scheme has been launched from here as well. We will undertake work under VBG Ramji with an expenditure of Rs. 7,700 crores from the Centre and another Rs. 4 thousand crores from the State. Under this scheme, the shape of villages will change with a total expenditure of over Rs. 11 thousand crores under the leadership of Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan. Under VBG Ramji, any work required for rural development is being undertaken with 125 working days. Trade talks with US in final stage, India to get competitive edge: Piyush Goyal

New Delhi, July 2 : The India-US bilateral trade agreement (BTA) talks have entered the final stage, with most key issues having been sorted out and both sides working towards a deal that gives New Delhi an advantage over its competitors, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Thursday. Speaking at the NDTV Indo-Japan Strategic Dialogue, Goyal said he does not foresee any major hurdles in concluding the US trade agreement despite recent legal and policy developments in Washington. "We don't see any difficulties with the US," Goyal



said, adding that "concessions and other elements have largely been finalised." He said India has consistently sought preferential market access over competing nations, a position that has been understood by the US administration. Following the US Supreme Court's decision

to strike down tariffs imposed under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA), Goyal said Washington is now working on an alternative mechanism that would preserve India's competitive advantage. He added that US Trade (Contd. on pg.2)

UNGA again urges adoption of terrorism convention proposed by India

United Nations, July 2 : The General Assembly has overwhelmingly again urged the adoption of the Comprehensive Convention on International Terrorism (CCIT) proposed by India. The Ninth Review of the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy (GCTS), which was carried by 140 votes with three against on Wednesday, urged member nations to "make every effort" to adopt the CCIT, which has been languishing for 31 years



after New Delhi proposed it. India's Permanent Representative P. Harish warned that the absence of a "universally agreed legal framework" has hobbled the fight against

roads, drainages, canals. We will manage this scheme in complete transparency with technology like geo-tagging and biometrics. We will bring water from Galeru Nagari to Kodur, and also groundwater through aquifers. We will increase. It is not a burden for the states to spend on this scheme, it is a responsibility. Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan has the honor of creating a Guinness record by holding Gram Sabhas in 13,226 villages at once. 7,000 km. of CC roads, 40 thousand Gokulas, 15,500 water tanks, 1.07 lakh farm ponds, 1,373 km of roads in tribal areas, and 1.66 lakh acres of orchards were cultivated. 55.44 crore work days were provided for employment guarantee works and Rs. 16,695 crores were spent. This year, we have set a target of developing 10 thousand km. of gravel roads, 1,500 km. of cement, BT roads, 500 km. of magic drains, and 1 lakh acres of orchards. Trade talks with US in final stage, India to get competitive edge:

Representative (USTR) Jamieson Greer has acknowledged India's position during the negotiations. Despite higher tariffs, India's exports to the US have remained resilient. Goyal said bilateral trade has continued to grow and projected that India's merchandise exports in the April-June quarter will rise about 15 per cent year-on-year. Goyal further stated that the India-UK Free Trade Agreement (FTA) will take effect on July 15, opening up new opportunities for Indian exporters. Besides, the legal scrutiny of the India-European Union Free Trade Agreement is expected to conclude within 10 to 12 days, after which it will move through the approval process, he added. The minister expressed confidence that the free trade pact would come into force before the end of the year, as all 27 EU member states support the agreement and no country has opposed the negotiations. He also highlighted the strategic importance of Japan in India's economic ambitions. While investment has historically been the cornerstone of bilateral ties, the minister said the next phase of the relationship should focus on expanding trade, technology partnerships and skilled workforce mobility, as Japan is a key partner in India's long-term growth strategy.

cooperation "only if there are no double standards (and) only if there is no distinction between good or bad terrorists". Opposition to the CCIT has come from Pakistan and some other countries that try to make an invidious distinction among terrorists, trying to cloak some in the garb of "freedom fighters" to justify their support for terrorism. "The international community must reject double standards in counter-terrorism," Harish said. "There can be no justification for terrorism. Irrespective of any grievance, political cause or strategic calculation, terrorism in all its forms and manifestations must be condemned unequivocally," he said. "There is an obligation to hold perpetrators, organisers, financiers and sponsors of terrorism accountable and bring them to justice (and) member states should ensure full cooperation in this regard", he said. Harish said the CCIT "is essential to close normative gaps, strengthen prosecution and extradition, and deny terrorists and their sponsors access to safe havens, funds and arms". "The time has come to demonstrate political will to conclude the CCIT," he declared. Editions of the GCTS, which cover national, regional and international strategy against terrorism, have been adopted unanimously during biennial reviews since the Assembly first approved it in 2006. But this time it was put to a vote at the insistence of the US, which criticised it as "bloated, outdated and lacking focus" and only Israel and Argentina joined it in voting against the GCTS. Forty-nine countries absented themselves during the vote, virtually not taking a position, and Japan, which formally abstained, later said it was a technical error and that it backed the document. Harish drew attention to the UN's narrow focus on the Abrahamic religions in countering prejudice at the exclusion of others. "As this is the United Nations, a multilateral forum of universal membership, our lens too should be universal", he said. "While we condemn all acts motivated by Islamophobia, Christianophobia and antisemitism, this august body must acknowledge that such phobias extend to other faiths as well," he pointed out.

originally approved in 2019 and witnessed foundation ceremonies in 2019 and again in 2023. However, despite repeated announcements and ceremonial events, the project failed to progress beyond the initial stage during the previous government's tenure. Following the formation of the present Government in 2024, the project was revived through sustained engagement with JSW, resolution of long-pending issues, timely policy decisions and coordinated action across departments, enabling it to finally enter the execution phase with the commencement of full-scale construction.Parallely, the Government has advanced critical external infrastructure required for the project. (ADCL). Soon after assuming office, Srinivas reportedly expedited several pending construction works in Amaravati by fixing project deadlines for contractors and closely monitoring their execution. His resignation within six months of taking charge has generated considerable discussion in administrative circles, particularly because Amaravati is currently witnessing renewed infrastructure activity. Apparently, his proactive approach did not go down well with some officials, who reportedly lodged a complaint with key political leaders in the state. While Srinivas cited personal reasons in his resignation letter, internal differences appear to have forced him to step down. There is also talk that he has received an attractive offer from Reliance Industries. It is also noteworthy that although Srinivas submitted his resignation on June 1, the government took nearly a month to approve it. Reports suggest that senior government functionaries had earlier persuaded him to continue after he initially expressed his intention to quit. The development comes amid several recent administrative changes within the APCRDA. In March, APCRDA Commissioner Kannababu was transferred and replaced by Vijayarama Raju, while Kannababu was appointed Commissioner of Civil Supplies. Two months ago, the government also appointed three additional commissioners to the APCRDA — Kollabathula Karthik, G. Suryasai Praveenchand and Dhathri Reddy — while Bhargav Teja continues to serve as another Additional Commissioner.

paid to pending applications and action should be taken without delay. AP Minister Gottipati Ravikumar orders measures to resolve power issues

Andhra Pradesh Minister Gottipati Ravikumar has directed officials to accelerate measures to resolve power outages and low-voltage issues across the state. The Minister reviewed the status of power supply, project progress, and thermal power generation. He ordered the completion of TRANSCO projects within the stipulated deadlines and instructed officials to review project delays with contractors to expedite the work. He emphasised the need for coordination with District Collectors to resolve field-level issues promptly. The Minister noted that the Plant Load Factor (PLF) of thermal plants exceeded 80 per cent between January and June, whereas it had remained between 45% and 50% during the previous government's tenure. The Minister instructed officials to ensure that thermal power stations maintain coal reserves sufficient for at



least 15 days.

He called for strengthening APGENCO and increasing captive power generation, while also directing officials to formulate a strategy to reduce power purchases. He further instructed that an action plan regarding BESS (Battery Energy Storage Systems) be prepared to meet future power requirements. Minister Gottipati Ravikumar directed officials to work towards enhancing public satisfaction with power sector services.

Rs 100.69-cr AMRUT 2.0 water project launched in Penukonda

Reliance sets up major plant at Orvakal; EV unit to start ops soon

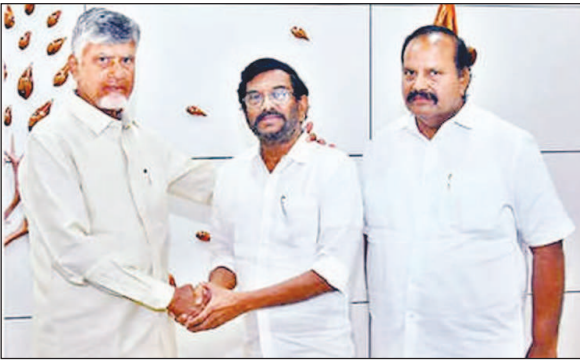

Andhra Pradesh Minister for Industries, Commerce and Food Processing, TG Bharath Gupta, has said the State Government is committed to accelerating Kurnool's industrial development with the twin objectives of generating large-scale employment and curbing migration from the district. The Minister made these remarks while participating in a pension distribution programme at Erraburuju in Kurnool city on Wednesday. During the programme, he visited beneficiaries at their residences, personally handed over pensions and interacted with families to understand their grievances. He said the public response during his visits to various wards reflected growing confidence in the coalition government's governance and welfare initiatives over the past two years. The Minister said the government, under the leadership of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu and Minister Nara Lokesh, is making sustained efforts to attract investments to Kurnool district.

Hotter North

For generations, countries of northern and western Europe were seen as places where summer meant pleasant sunshine rather than a struggle for survival. India, by contrast, has long lived with the annual ordeal of extreme heat. That distinction is beginning to blur. As parts of France, Spain and the United Kingdom record temperatures that rival or exceed those routinely associated with the tropics, the world is witnessing more than another difficult summer. South Asians & Diaspora

It is watching climate geography being rewritten. The significance lies not simply in the numbers on the thermometer but in the societies confronting them. India has evolved, however imperfectly, with an understanding that summer can be dangerous. Air-conditioning remains inaccessible to millions, but the country has increasingly adopted heat action plans, revised work schedules, early warning systems and public awareness campaigns after repeated deadly heatwaves. European societies, whose infrastructure, housing, public transport and even tourism were designed for milder climates, are discovering that prosperity does not automatically translate into climate resilience. The economic implications are substantial.

Heat is no longer merely an environmental concern but an economic variable. Productivity declines, energy demand surges, transport networks buckle, crops suffer and insurance costs rise. Museums close, schools alter schedules, outdoor work becomes hazardous and electricity grids come under unprecedented strain. Every new record exposes another weakness in infrastructure built for a different climate. For India, Europe's predicament should not invite schadenfreude but reflection. If wealthy nations with advanced public services find themselves struggling to cope with prolonged extreme heat, countries with larger populations, greater urban congestion and wider economic disparities face an even steeper challenge.

The question is no longer whether heatwaves will intensify, but whether governments can adapt quickly enough to minimise the human and economic costs. This also challenges a lingering misconception that climate change is primarily a future problem or one confined to vulnerable developing nations. The burden is increasingly global, though its consequences remain unequal. Rich countries may possess greater financial resources to adapt, but they are learning that decades of infrastructure investment cannot be redesigned overnight. Poorer countries often have greater experience living with heat but far fewer resources to protect their citizens.

The emerging reality demands a shift in public policy. Climate adaptation deserves the same seriousness as roads, defence or public health. Urban planning must prioritise cooling, green spaces and resilient buildings. Water management, power systems and labour regulations must account for temperatures that once seemed exceptional but are becoming routine. Europe's unprecedented heat is therefore not simply Europe's story. It is a reminder that the climate dividing line between temperate and tropical regions is becoming less meaningful. In a warming world, no nation can assume that yesterday's weather will define tomorrow's normal. The sooner governments accept that reality, the better prepared their societies will be for the summers that lie ahead.

2027 delimitation must go beyond North-South talk

When India's Delimitation Commission next convenes, it will inherit a task that no commission has faced in fifty years: the freedom to actually change how many parliamentary seats each state sends to the Lok Sabha. The 84th Constitutional Amendment of 2001 froze that allocation until after the first census taken after 2026. The 2027 Census will lift that freeze, and the redistribution of roughly 281 new seats across 36 states and Union Territories will follow.

The political debate has focused almost entirely on the North-South dimension, on whether states such as Kerala and Tamil Nadu, which succeeded in controlling population growth, will now be punished for that success by a reallocation that rewards higher-growth Hindi-belt states. That concern is legitimate, and it deserves the attention it has received. But it has obscured an equally consequential question that will determine whether any new boundaries actually improve Indian democracy: which constituencies within states should be split, into how many parts, and on what evidence? An EAC-PM working paper provides the most systematic answer yet attempted.

Drawing on a panel of 2,171 constituency-elections across four general elections from 2009 to 2024 and linking each constituency to its demographic and linguistic profile, it overturns one of the oldest assumptions in Indian electoral studies. For decades, conventional wisdom held that large constituencies suppress voter turnout. The logic seemed self-evident: queues at metropolitan polling booths can run for hours, per-capita polling-station access in dense urban areas is lower, and the voter in a constituency of two million feels more remote from power than the voter in one of 500,000. Smaller constituencies, on this reading, should vote more. And they do, in the raw data. The smallest

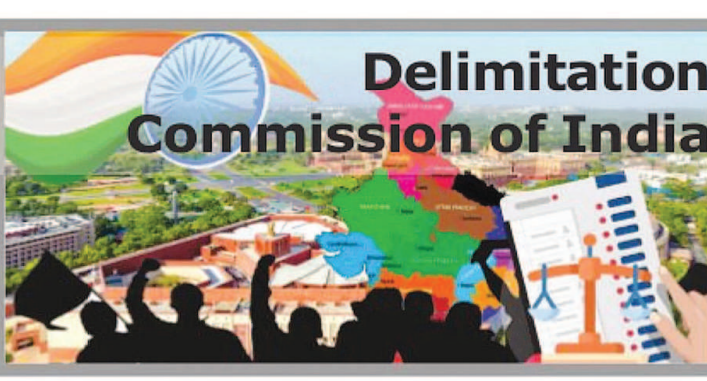
decile of constituencies turned out at a remarkable 22.9 percentage points above the largest decile in 2009. But that gap has been halving steadily. By 2024, it had fallen to 12 percentage points.

More importantly, once you account for the demographic and linguistic composition of constituencies, how urban they are, how many residents belong to Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, how linguistically polarised or diverse the local population is, the size penalty largely disappears and by 2024 reverses. A constituency with two million electors at a typical demographic profile now turns out approximately six percentage points higher than a comparable one with one million electors. The residual "size penalty" in the raw data turns out to be a composition effect. Smaller constituencies tend to be more rural, more tribal, and more linguistically polarised, and it is those features, not smallness itself, that drive higher turnout. Five compositional features dominate the picture, and they have been reorganising over the past fifteen years in ways that do not point in the same direction. Scheduled Tribe constituencies have emerged as the highest turnout category in Indian politics. The most ST-heavy decile of constituencies reached 73 per cent turnout in 2024, the highest of any group on any dimension in the research. Scheduled Caste constituencies, which once voted at a premium above the national average, have converged down to roughly the national mean. Urban constituencies, which in 2009 voted marginally above rural ones, now vote below them, a reversal that tracks India's ongoing but uneven urbanisation.

Linguistic structure, too, matters enormously. Constituencies in which a few large language communities coexist and compete have outpolled low-polarisation constituencies by eleven to thirteen percentage points in

every election of the past fifteen years, without exception. Where a few large groups believe the election will turn on their own mobilisation, each member of each group has a strong reason to vote. Constituencies with high overall linguistic diversity, many language communities coexisting, have been catching up as a turnout amplifier since 2014. The sharpest and most consequential finding is about gender. Women's electoral participation is dramatically more sensitive to constituency composition than men's. Urban share is the single largest predictor of female turnout, and the urban penalty for women is more than double the urban penalty for men.

Women in fully urban constituencies today turn out approximately five percentage points below rural women at every constituency size. For men, the urban gap is around two percentage points. This asymmetry has a clear structural logic. Dense female-targeted welfare networks, women's self-help groups, Anganwadi centres, vernacular health and microcredit programmes, are concentrated in rural India and provide a powerful social infrastructure for mobilising female voters. Urban anonymity and higher time costs of voting, particularly for working women with care responsibilities, weaken those networks precisely where constituency sizes and booth loads are highest. The implication is uncomfortable. The least-participating subgroup in Indian democracy today is not the rural poor. It is the woman in a large, fully urban metropolitan constituency. The most-participating subgroup is the woman in a high-Scheduled Tribe, rural constituency. A targeted delimitation plan concentrating three-way splits on large metropolitan and linguistically complex constituencies, and two-way splits on secondary-urban ones, is estimated to raise national voter



turnout by between 0.3 and 2.3 percentage points at the next general election. That range reflects genuine statistical uncertainty. It corresponds to between nine and twenty-three million additional voters. Thirty-four of thirty-six states and Union Territories show a positive predicted gain.

The constituencies identified for three-way splits are heterogeneous: they include fully urban metropolitan seats such as Hyderabad, Secunderabad, and Kolkata South, but also rural Scheduled-Tribe constituencies such as Lohardaga in Jharkhand and Kandhamal in Odisha, whose joint demographic and linguistic depth generates steep predicted gains from splitting. There are, however, two things that splitting alone cannot do. It cannot close the female-urban participation gap. The residual five-percentage-point female urban penalty is preserved within every daughter constituency that a split would create, because the daughters inherit the parent constituency's compositional profile. Closing that gap requires accompanying operational reform: women-only polling booths in urban metropolitan constituencies, extended polling hours that accommodate the time constraints of urban working women, transport linkages from urban-fringe residential areas to polling stations, and women-targeted voter-roll drives using existing civic networks.

It cannot resolve the deeper constitutional question about

how states are represented in Parliament. Legal scholars have pointed out that the proposed approach of expanding the Lok Sabha on a pro-rata basis, preserving each state's current proportional share anchored in the 1971 Census freeze, extends rather than resolves a fifty-year-old political bargain that sits uneasily with the Constitution's original design. A more durable solution may lie in reforming the Rajya Sabha into a genuine forum for state interests, with meaningful powers over fiscal legislation and a rebalanced seat allocation that gives smaller states a structural voice. As India urbanises rapidly, the share of the electorate in large metropolitan constituencies will continue to rise.

Whether that rising urban share translates into falling national turnout or into a renewed wave of female and urban participation will be decided largely by what the Delimitation Commission chooses to do and what operational reforms accompany it. The 2027 Census offers India its first real chance in five decades to redesign the building blocks of its democracy. The empirical case for doing so wisely, and the constitutional stakes of doing so hastily, have rarely been clearer. The North-South debate is important. But the quality of the constituencies we create, who lives in them, how they are composed, and whether women in cities can actually participate in them, may matter even more.

How India and Japan can together navigate US shiftig Indo-Pacific strategy

The debate surrounding the United States' decision to revert from "Indo-Pacific Command" to "Pacific Command" has generated considerable speculation. Some view it as signalling a diminished American commitment to the Indo-Pacific, while others dismiss it as little more than a bureaucratic adjustment. Both interpretations miss the larger point.

The decision is perhaps best understood within the broader context of the United States' own search for strategic and national identity. President Donald Trump and the Make America Great Again movement have consistently sought to reconnect America with what they regard as the country's post-Second World War golden age-a period when the United States projected unparalleled military strength, economic confidence and global leadership. Other symbolic initiatives, including proposals to revive the title "Department of War" and restore historical military base names, reflect a wider effort to recover an earlier understanding of America's purpose in the world. Whether one agrees with this project or not is secondary. Great powers periodically revisit their history in order to shape their future. America is doing so today.

Rather than becoming absorbed in debating the title of an American military command, India and Japan should draw a different conclusion. If Washington is redefining its strategic narrative, the time has come for the original architects of the Indo-Pacific idea to reaffirm and refresh their own.

The modern Indo-Pacific concept did not originate in Washington.

It was articulated most powerfully by the late Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, whose vision of the "confluence of the two seas" brought together the Indian and Pacific Oceans into a single strategic and civilizational space. Prime Minister Narendra Modi embraced and developed that vision, giving it practical expression through initiatives ranging from maritime cooperation to the Quad. As the Indo-Pacific gained international prominence, however, its meaning gradually narrowed. Increasingly, it came to be understood primarily through the prism of military alliances, strategic competition and the challenge posed by China's rise. These issues remain important, but they were never intended to define the Indo-Pacific in its entirety.

The original vision was broader and deeper.

The Indo-Pacific is not simply a geopolitical theatre. It is one of the world's oldest interconnected civilizational spaces. For over two millennia, the seas linking India, Southeast Asia, China and Japan carried not only goods but also ideas, religions, technologies, artistic traditions and systems of knowledge. Buddhism travelled from India across Asia. Hindu cultural influences shaped kingdoms throughout Southeast Asia. Chinese civilisation enriched the region through commerce, scholarship, innovation and maritime exchange. Together, these interactions created an enduring Asian community long before the emergence of modern

nation states.

This shared heritage remains one of Asia's greatest strategic assets.

No meaningful civilizational conception of the Indo-Pacific can overlook China. Contemporary strategic differences are real and, in some cases, profound. They must be managed with clarity and realism. Yet China has also been an integral participant in the historical exchanges that shaped Asia for centuries. Recognising this heritage does not require overlooking present-day disagreements. Rather, it acknowledges that a durable regional order cannot be built solely around rivalry. Strategic competition may persist, but it need not become the organising principle of the Indo-Pacific.

Today, both America and Europe are engaged in searching debates about their own civilizational identity. Questions of history, culture, national purpose and strategic direction increasingly shape both domestic politics and foreign policy. Such introspection is neither unusual nor undesirable. Great powers periodically redefine themselves.

India and Japan should undertake a similar exercise-but in a characteristically Asian way. Rather than constructing a civilizational narrative based on exclusion, they should build one based on connection. The Indo-Pacific should be understood as a region linked by centuries of interaction and capable of accommodating diversity while respecting national sovereignty. Such an approach would restore Southeast Asia to its rightful place at the heart of the Indo-



Pacific conversation-not as an arena of great-power competition, but as the historic bridge between the Indian and Pacific Oceans.

A renewed Indo-Pacific vision should therefore rest on multiple pillars. Security cooperation will remain indispensable. Economic integration must continue. Technological collaboration will become increasingly important. But these should be reinforced by deeper cooperation in education, maritime heritage, cultural exchanges, Buddhist and historical networks, scientific research, digital connectivity and sustainable development. Civilization should not replace strategy; it should enrich it.

The ongoing visit of Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi to New Delhi offers an ideal opportunity to begin this conversation. While defence, technology and economic cooperation have rightly dominated the bilateral agenda, the two leaders should also consider how India and Japan can jointly restore the broader intellectual and civilizational foundations of the Indo-Pacific concept they did so much to shape.

The subsequent G20 Summit in

Florida could provide an international platform for advancing this complementary vision. India and Japan need not distance themselves from the United States. On the contrary, they should continue working closely with Washington in promoting regional stability. But they should also ensure that the Indo-Pacific is not defined solely by American strategic vocabulary or by the changing priorities of successive administrations.

America will continue to redefine its place in the world according to its own history and political choices. That is both natural and inevitable. India and Japan should do the same. Their task, however, is not to recreate an earlier age but to shape a new one-an Indo-Pacific that is strategically secure, economically dynamic and civilizationally confident.

The debate over Pacific Command will eventually fade. The opportunity to renew the Indo-Pacific idea should not. The concept was born in Asia. Its next chapter should also be written in Asia.

Qatar reports ‘positive progress’ in US-Iran talks, next round to follow Khamenei funeral; Tehran blocks IAEA from bombed sites

Indirect negotiations between the United States and Iran have registered fresh momentum after mediators from Qatar and Pakistan reported “positive progress” during separate meetings with both sides in Doha. The parties have agreed to resume discussions after the funeral ceremonies for Iran’s former Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei. The latest round of diplomacy suggests that efforts to preserve the understanding reached under the 14-point Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) remain on track despite continuing disagreements over sanctions, nuclear inspections and regional security. While Washington has expressed optimism over the talks, Tehran has reiterated that it will not compromise on issues it considers matters of sovereignty. Qatar says talks will resume after funeral ceremonies. Majed Al Ansari, adviser to Qatar’s prime minister and official spokesperson for the Foreign Ministry, said separate meetings with American and Iranian negotiators concluded in Doha with positive movement on issues linked to the Islamabad MoU. According to Al Ansari, the discussions built on the outcomes of the Lake Lucerne Summit, and both sides agreed to continue negotiations at the earliest opportunity after the funeral processions for former Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei. Qatar & Pakistan mediators concluded separate meetings with the US & Iranian negotiators in Doha today, with positive progress made on issues related to the Islamabad Memorandum of Understanding, building on the outcomes of the Lake Lucerne Summit. The parties agreed to continue... Dr. Majed Al Ansari (@majedalansari) July 1, 2026 Iran’s Deputy Foreign Minister for Legal and International Affairs Kazem Gharibabadi said Tehran raised concerns over what it described as Washington’s failure to fulfil commitments related to Lebanon during the Doha discussions. He also said Iranian and Qatari officials reviewed arrangements for using part of the initially frozen USD 6 billion in Iranian funds to procure essential goods for the country. “In the meetings with Qatari officials, the issues related to the expenditure of part of the initial USD 6 billion were reviewed, and it was agreed that, based on the announced needs, the purchase of required goods will be carried out and placed at Iran’s disposal,” said Gharibabadi. Tehran rejects IAEA access to bombed nuclear facilities



As diplomatic engagement continued, Iranian Parliament Speaker Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf ruled out allowing inspectors from the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) to visit nuclear facilities damaged during the conflict. “Talk of IAEA inspectors’ access to bombed sites is false,” Ghalibaf said during an interview with Iranian state television. He said legislation passed by Parliament and the Supreme National Security Council prohibits access to damaged facilities under any circumstances. According to Ghalibaf, IAEA inspectors currently have access only to the Bushehr nuclear power plant and the Tehran research reactor. He also defended his participation in negotiations held in Switzerland, saying they accelerated the release of Iranian assets and the suspension of sanctions while helping secure previously agreed conditions. Pezeshkian defends diplomacy amid domestic criticism Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian rejected criticism from hardline factions over the government’s indirect engagement with Washington. He said every diplomatic step had been taken within Iran’s established decision-making framework and under the guidance of Supreme Leader Mojtaba Khamenei. “If the leadership had ordered no negotiations, we would have certainly obeyed,” Pezeshkian said. He added that the Supreme National Security Council overwhelmingly backed the diplomatic process, with 12 of its 13 members supporting the current approach. The Iranian President maintained that all measures undertaken by his administration were consistent with the country’s broader strategic policies. US says negotiations are progressing well US Vice President JD Vance also expressed confidence in the Doha process, saying technical-level discussions involving American, Iranian and Qatari officials were

progressing well. “It’s still pretty early, but talks are going well,” Vance told CNN. He said technical negotiators were working through detailed issues before discussions shifted to Iran’s nuclear programme. “Well, right now, the technical negotiators are sitting down with the Iranians, with the Qataris, and with others in Doha, talking about some of the details here,” he said, adding: “We’re worried about the nuclear issue. We’re going to start talking about that, so right now the talks are going well”. In the meantime, Vance, speaking at Naval Air Station Oceana in Virginia Beach, argued that the negotiations were taking place from what he described as a position of strength following recent US military operations. President Donald Trump also struck an optimistic tone, saying efforts towards the “denuclearisation” of Iran were progressing and reiterating that Tehran would not be allowed to obtain a nuclear weapon. “They’ve come a long way. We hit them very hard last week. They’re fine. We’re going to get it. It’s the denuclearisation of Iran,” Trump said. Frozen assets, Lebanon commitments remain key issues Iranian officials said the Doha discussions also focused on the implementation of commitments under the Islamabad MoU. According to Gharibabadi, Tehran accused Washington of failing to honour commitments relating to Lebanon and stressed that the agreement must be implemented as a single package rather than through selective provisions. He said a direct communication mechanism would be established between members of the joint monitoring group to document, review and address future implementation issues. The latest round of talks concluded without direct high-level US-Iran negotiations, but both sides agreed to continue indirect engagement through Qatari and Pakistani mediators in the coming weeks.

Russia launches overnight missile and drone barrage on Kyiv; apartment block collapses, fires erupt

Kyiv, July 3: Russia launched a fresh wave of overnight missile and drone attacks on Ukraine’s capital, Kyiv, early Thursday, triggering powerful explosions across the city, damaging residential buildings and igniting multiple fires. The assault came amid growing fears of an escalation in the conflict, with Ukrainian officials warning residents in advance to prepare for another large-scale strike. Air-raid sirens wailed across Kyiv late Wednesday night as successive waves of Russian attack drones and ballistic missiles approached the city. Ukrainian air-defence systems were activated immediately, engaging incoming threats for several hours. Despite interception efforts, several explosions were heard across different parts of the capital, causing panic among residents and widespread damage. The attack followed a warning from Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, who said intelligence reports indicated that Russia was preparing another major strike on Kyiv. He urged citizens to remain vigilant, closely monitor air-raid alerts, and immediately seek shelter whenever warnings were issued. Thousands of Kyiv residents responded by taking refuge in underground subway stations, many carrying sleeping bags, blankets, and pets as they



prepared for what officials described as a potentially prolonged assault. Authorities had advised residents to remain indoors and avoid unnecessary travel during the night. Kyiv Mayor Vitali Klitschko confirmed that emergency services had been deployed across multiple districts following reports of fires and structural damage. He urged people to remain inside bomb shelters after ballistic missiles entered Ukrainian airspace, warning that additional strikes could follow. One of the most serious incidents occurred when a nine-storey apartment building partially collapsed after being struck during the attack. Rescue teams rushed to the site, fearing that several residents could be trapped beneath the rubble. Firefighters and search-and-rescue personnel worked through the night to locate survivors and extinguish fires. Authorities also reported multiple blazes in different parts of the city, including a major fire in

the city centre. Emergency crews battled flames on the roof of a hotel, while another residential building caught fire in a separate district. Thick smoke was seen rising over several neighbourhoods as rescue operations continued. The complete extent of casualties was not immediately known. Mayor Klitschko said at least five medical workers were injured while responding to the emergency, though officials cautioned that casualty figures could rise as rescue efforts progressed. The latest attack comes as Ukraine has intensified its own long-range drone operations targeting Russian territory. In recent weeks, Ukrainian forces have carried out strikes on fuel infrastructure inside Russia, launched drone attacks near Moscow, and continued military operations in Crimea, the Black Sea peninsula annexed by Russia in 2014. Kyiv says these operations are aimed at increasing pressure on Moscow and weakening its military capabilities.

Speaking during a visit to Ireland before returning to Ukraine, President Zelenskyy reiterated that Russian President Vladimir Putin remained determined to continue the war. “Putin wants to keep fighting. That is why he must face conditions that make it impossible for him to keep this war going,” Zelenskyy said. Meanwhile, diplomatic tensions between Russia and the United States also remain high. On June 25, Russia reiterated its warning to Washington over continued military assistance to Ukraine. Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said Moscow had repeatedly expressed concerns about Western weapons supplies to Kyiv, arguing that continued military support could have “unforeseen consequences” for regional and global security. She also criticised Zelenskyy over his recent remarks concerning Belarus, accusing him of displaying what she described as a “terrorist nature.” The overnight assault underscores the continuing intensity of the war, with both sides escalating military operations even as diplomatic efforts to end the conflict remain stalled. Emergency responders continue rescue operations in Kyiv as authorities assess the full scale of the damage caused by the latest Russian strikes.

Venezuela earthquake toll climbs to 2,295; seven-day national mourning declared

Venezuela has declared seven days of national mourning after the death toll from the twin earthquakes that struck the country on June 24 rose to 2,295, according to the latest official update. The revised toll reflects the scale of the disaster as rescue operations continue across affected regions. Authorities said more than 11,000 people have been injured, thousands have been rescued, and temporary camps are being expanded to accommodate those displaced by the earthquakes. National Assembly President Jorge Rodriguez said on Wednesday (local time) that 11,267 people had been injured and 12,841 had been affected by the disaster. He said rescue teams had pulled 6,461 people to safety. More than 4,000 domestic and international rescue workers and volunteers remain engaged in search and relief operations. Temporary camps expanded as rescue efforts continue Rodriguez, who also heads the com-



mand centre overseeing temporary shelters, said authorities were rapidly equipping relief camps and relocating affected residents. He urged health workers, firefighters and security personnel to register on the Patria platform to support housing and rehabilitation efforts. According to the official update, 25 temporary camps are currently operational. Thirteen are in La Guaira, eight in Caracas, two in Miranda, one in Carabobo and one in Yaracuy. Hundreds of aftershocks recorded since June 24 Authorities said Venezuela has experienced 782 aftershocks since the twin earth-

quakes struck on June 24. Rodriguez said both the frequency and intensity of the tremors had declined in recent days. Acting president announces week-long national mourning Acting president Delcy Rodriguez announced a seven-day period of national mourning beginning at 6 p.m. on Wednesday (local time). “In honour of the memory of the victims, I have decided to decree National Mourning for seven (7) days, starting at 6:00 p.m. today,” she said in a statement shared on social media. “In these moments of profound sadness, we embrace those who suffer from this tragedy and reaffirm our commitment to accompany and protect them,” she said. “Venezuela’s soul is torn by the human losses caused by the devastating earthquakes,” Rodriguez added. The earthquakes struck Venezuela on June 24 and triggered a large-scale rescue and relief operation that remains underway.

Delhi-NCR premium housing sales jump 30%, homes above Rs 1 Crore make up 71% of demand: Report



Delhi-NCR’s premium residential market continued to outperform the broader housing sector in the first quarter of 2026, with housing sales rising 30 per cent year-on-year. This growth was driven by higher incomes, infrastructure-led growth and sustained demand from affluent homebuyers, according to a report by Equirus Securities. The brokerage said the premiumisation trend has strengthened significantly, with homes priced above ₹1 crore

accounting for nearly 71 per cent of all residential transactions in the region during the January-March quarter. Developers also stepped up supply, with new residential launches increasing 64 per cent year-on-year, reflecting confidence in sustained demand despite early signs of moderation in the wider housing market. Equirus attributed the strong performance to robust employment growth, rising household incomes and large-scale infrastructure projects, including the

Dwarka Expressway and the Noida International Airport. These developments are expanding the premium residential catchment across Delhi-NCR and enhancing the region’s long-term investment appeal, the report said. While the brokerage expects the overall residential market to enter a more moderate growth phase due to macroeconomic uncertainties, softer white-collar hiring and a higher base, it believes the premium housing segment is likely to remain resilient. According to the report, homebuyers are increasingly favouring quality-led developments over speculative investments, with greater emphasis on established brands, timely project execution, financial strength, corporate governance and differentiated

offerings. Equirus said developers such as Max Estates, ATS, DLF and Oberoi Realty are well placed to benefit from these structural shifts, backed by their execution track record, premium product portfolios and disciplined balance sheets. The report also identified non-resident Indians (NRIs) and high-net-worth individuals (HNIs) as key drivers of premium housing demand. Although geopolitical tensions in the Middle East could temporarily weigh on overseas investments into Indian real estate, Equirus expects NRI participation to remain on a long-term growth trajectory, supported by rupee depreciation, increased confidence in regulated projects and a growing preference for branded developers.

Sensex jumps 579 points, Nifty tops 24,175 as easing oil prices lift market mood

Mumbai, July 2 : Indian benchmark equity indices ended sharply higher on Thursday, supported by a decline in global crude oil prices after encouraging signs emerged from trade talks between the United States and Iran, boosting investor sentiment. The Nifty closed at 24,175.70, gaining 169.85 points, or 0.71 per cent, while the Sensex advanced 579.48 points, or 0.75 per cent, to settle at 77,502.12. Commenting on Nifty technical outlook, experts said that the index witnessed steady buying interest throughout the session and gradually advanced towards the 24,200 resistance zone. "From a technical perspective, a sustained breakout above this band would reinforce bullish momentum and could pave the



way for an advance towards the 24,400–24,450 region, where the 200-day EMA is positioned,” a market expert said. “On the downside, the 24,000 psychological mark is expected to act as the immediate support zone,” the expert added. Technology stocks led the rally, with Infosys, Tech Mahindra and Tata Consultancy Services emerging as the top gainers in the Nifty index. The strong performance

helped the Nifty IT index register its biggest single-day gain since May 2025. The broader market also participated in the uptrend. The Nifty MidCap index ended 0.48 per cent higher, while the Nifty SmallCap index outperformed with a gain of 1.25 per cent. Among sectoral indices, the Nifty IT was the best performer of the day. The Nifty Auto, Nifty Consumer Durables and Nifty Realty indices also posted strong gains as positive global cues and easing concerns over oil prices lifted market sentiment. "Easing energy prices and fresh India-Japan agreements in strategic areas such as AI, defence technology and energy security helped sustain domestic market optimism," as per the analyst.

'What started as a dream has become a reality': Shah Rukh Khan on Knight Riders' international cricket stadium in LA

Los Angeles, July 2 : Bollywood Superstar and Kolkata Knight Riders co-owner Shah Rukh Khan hailed the opening of the Knight Riders Cricket Ground in Los Angeles as the realisation of a long-cherished dream after the venue hosted its first-ever Major League Cricket (MLC) match, with the Knight Riders Group becoming the first global cricket franchise to establish an international-standard cricket stadium.

The Los Angeles Knight Riders (LAKR) took on Washington Freedom in the inaugural fixture at the newly-built venue, marking another milestone in cricket's growing presence in the United States. Reflecting on the historic occasion, Shah Rukh Khan said the project was the culmination of years of planning and a vision to take cricket to newer audiences. "What started as a dream has become a reality today. Bringing cricket, the second most-watched sport in the world, to Los Angeles is a landmark moment for all of us. Through this long-term partnership between Fairplex and Knight Riders, we are creating much more than a cricket venue. We are building a space that celebrates community, togetherness, energy and entertainment. It is a place built not just for sport, but also for entertainment, for families, and for mem-



ories that will last forever," he said. Expressing his hopes for the future, Shah Rukh Khan said he wanted the ground to become the city's cricketing home and inspire generations of players and fans. "We hope this becomes a home for cricket in Los Angeles and inspires generations of fans and players alike. This is for Los Angeles, for cricket fans across the globe, and for the Knight Riders family. Believe in Purple and Gold," he added. Knight Riders Sports CEO Venky Mysore described the stadium as a defining moment in the franchise's global journey. "The Knight Riders Cricket Ground, LA is much more than a stadium; it is a statement of intent

for the future of cricket. Becoming the first global cricket brand to establish an international cricket stadium is a proud milestone for the Knight Riders Group and reflects our belief that the growth of the game must be supported by world-class infrastructure," Mysore said. Built to international standards, the Knight Riders Cricket Ground features eight wickets on the main square, ICC-standard playing dimensions, six 120-foot floodlight towers and required the movement of over 32,000 metric tonnes of earth during construction. The venue will stage Major League Cricket matches from July 1 to July 5, reinforcing the United States' emergence as one of cricket's fastest-growing markets.

If Vaibhav needs to play, he should, but not at the expense of dropping someone: Pujara



New Delhi, July 2 : Former India batter Cheteshwar Pujara addressed the discussion surrounding India's top order ahead of the second T20I against England, making it clear that he does not believe Sanju Samson should lose his place to accommodate Vaibhav Sooryavanshi despite growing calls for the teenage batter to be included in the playing XI. The veteran batter added that constant speculation over Samson's place in the side was unnecessary, insisting the wicketkeeper-batter deserves a longer run. "I think India should persist with Sanju Samson. I don't think he should be

feeling any pressure. He has proved himself in the T20 World Cup and, with the kind of talent he possesses, he should be there in the playing XI," Pujara said on JioStar. "There shouldn't be a lot of noise about dropping Sanju Samson. He is a quality player and should get a longer run. Sanju just needs to bat naturally and not think too much," he added. While Pujara acknowledged that Sooryavanshi has earned an opportunity, he argued that the youngster's inclusion should not come at the cost of disrupting India's established top order. "If Vaibhav needs to play, he should play, but not at the expense of dropping someone,

rather by resting someone. If you want to give him an opportunity, that is fine. But you shouldn't be dropping any of India's top three players, whether it's Sanju, Abhishek or Ishan Kishan. Having said that, Vaibhav does deserve an opportunity, and his opportunity will come," he mentioned.

Pujara also praised captain Shreyas Iyer's composed innings after India recovered from an early setback to post a competitive total in the rain-hit opening T20I against England in Durham. With India losing early wickets after electing to bat first, Pujara said Iyer's ability to steady the innings before accelerating played a decisive role in putting the visitors in a strong position. Pujara felt Iyer delivered exactly what was expected of a captain after India found themselves under pressure in the powerplay, balancing caution with aggression as the innings progressed. "It was an important knock from Shreyas Iyer

and, when you are leading the team, you always look to lead from the front. He showed a lot of maturity because India were in trouble after losing a couple of early wickets," Pujara told JioStar. He also credited Iyer for pacing his innings according to the match situation before shifting gears once he was well established at the crease. "Abhishek played a good knock, but it was important for Shreyas to hold one end up and take his time. Once he was set, he played some quality shots," he added. According to Pujara, the India captain's innings reflected both responsibility and leadership, leaving the side in an excellent position by the end of its 20 overs. "If you look at his innings at the end of the 20 overs, you know that, as a captain, you have done your job. You have put your team in a very commanding position. This was a perfect knock from Shreyas, both as a leader and as a batter," he said.

'Had enough runs to defend': Parthiv backs India's batting efforts in washed-out T20I vs ENG

New Delhi, July 2 : Former India wicketkeeper Parthiv Patel backed India's batting display after the rain-hit opening T20I against England in Durham ended without a result on Wednesday. India, who opted to bat first after winning the toss, posted 190 before persistent rain prevented the second innings from getting underway. Assessing the visitors' performance after play was called off, Patel said the innings showed India's willingness to adapt to English conditions and highlighted Abhishek Sharma's impact at the top of the order. According to Patel, India embraced the challenge of batting in unfamiliar conditions instead of taking a cautious approach. "From India's point of view, they needed this kind of batting performance, especially after what had happened in Ireland. They wanted to challenge themselves; they wanted to adapt to the conditions early, and India did that really well in this game," Patel told JioStar.

"190 runs on this pitch, with three spinners bowling through the middle overs, I thought India had enough runs to defend. Nevertheless, they will definitely be more confident going into the second T20I," he added. The former India cricketer also reserved special praise for Abhishek Sharma, crediting the left-hander for quickly reading the nature of the surface and making the most of scoring opportunities. "I thought he batted really well. He understood the conditions well. There was a slightly spongier bounce in Durham, but he made sure that whenever the opportunity presented itself, he capitalised on it," he stated. Patel pointed to Abhishek's aggressive intent against both pace and



spin as one of the defining features of the innings, as he said, "That over from Saqib Mahmood was an important one, where he stepped out and hit three boundaries, two over point and one over mid-off. Then, when the spinners came on, he chose the right areas to hit those sixes." Looking beyond the knock itself, Patel said performances in overseas conditions continue to reinforce Abhishek's credentials as one of the leading batters in the shortest format.

T20 is here to stay, not too sure about ODI cricket: Ashwin

New Delhi, July 2 : Former India off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin believes T20 cricket has cemented its place as the format that will drive the sport's future, while expressing doubts over the long-term sustainability of One-Day Internationals.

Speaking during a media interaction after the European T20 Premier League (ETPL) 2026 Player Draft on Thursday, the Dublin Guardians captain and mentor said T20's shorter duration makes it the ideal vehicle for cricket's global expansion and its return to the Olympic Games. Responding to a question on whether cricket's growth in emerging nations should focus only on T20s or extend equally to other formats, Ashwin stressed that players must first master the art of adapting to different situations, irrespective of the



format they play. "I think cricket as a whole needs to be learned in a way that you get better every single day. You should be able to adapt. The name of the game is adaptation," Ashwin said in a media interaction following the conclusion of the ETPL 2026 Player Draft. He pointed to India's recent T20I series against Ireland as an example of how external conditions can significantly influence the shortest format, forcing players to evolve constantly.

"Which is why what happened recently between India and Ireland in that T20 series is a classic example of how conditions can eliminate a lot of aspects of the game that have been developed as a root cause of T20 as a sport," the all-rounder added. The veteran spinner, however, believes that when it comes to expanding cricket's footprint across new markets, T20 remains the most practical and effective format. "But that aside, our job

will be purely on T20 cricket and how it can get better. And if the game has to become global and it has to become an Olympic sport, the shorter the game, the more viable it is," the Dublin Guardians captain and mentor stated.

Ashwin said the format's accessibility and the opportunities created by franchise leagues around the world would continue to fuel its growth and expose a wider pool of players to elite competition, stating, "And that's how it's going to become much bigger, and you will see a better sample size of players. Which is also very critical for several of these leagues, which run through the year."

The 38-year-old then offered a blunt assessment of how he views the future of the game's formats. "T20 as a sport is here to stay. I am not too sure about ODI cricket."

India to tour Sri Lanka for a two-match Test series from August 15-27



Colombo, July 2 : India has been confirmed to tour Sri Lanka in August 2026 for a two-match Test series, which will be part of the ongoing ICC World Test Championship (WTC) 2025-2027 cycle, Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) announced on Thursday. According to a statement by SLC, the opening Test match will be played at the picturesque Galle International Cricket Stadium

(GICS) from August 15 to 19. The second and final Test is scheduled to be held at the Sinhalese Sports Club (SSC) in Colombo from August 23 to 27. Both matches are scheduled to commence at 10 am local time. The two-

game assignment holds significance for both teams as they look to climb up the WTC standings. In the current WTC cycle points table, the Shubman Gill-led India have a points percentage (PCT) of 48.15 after nine matches and are in fifth place. Sri Lanka, meanwhile, are at the sixth spot with a PCT of 44.44. A series victory will provide a much-needed push for

either side in their bid to secure a top-two finish and make the final. The upcoming series marks India's return to Sri Lanka for playing Tests after 2017, when, under the captaincy of Virat Kohli, they managed to get a clean sweep victory.

With the Lanka Premier League (LPL) scheduled to conclude on August 8, the Test series against India will begin after it ends. There was no mention from the SLC on the addition of a three-match T20I series between India and Sri Lanka, which was initially proposed with an aim to raise funds for relief and reconstruction efforts in the island nation following Cyclone Ditwah.

As of now, Dhruv Jurel-led India A are currently in Sri Lanka for a two-match red-ball shadow tour in Galle. After the first game ended in a draw, the second four-day match is currently underway.

Entire world waiting to see Sooryavanshi play, will feature in all three formats soon, says Karim

New Delhi, July 2 : Teenage batting sensation Vaibhav Sooryavanshi is not only the cynosure of Indian fans, but also of the entire cricketing world, who is eagerly waiting to see him perform at the highest level, said former India selector and wicket-keeper Saba Karim.

Sooryavanshi, who grabbed headlines by amassing 776 runs at a staggering strike-rate of 237.30 to bag the Player-of-the-Tournament honour in IPL 2026 for Rajasthan Royals, is currently eyeing a much-anticipated international debut for India in the ongoing five-match T20I series against England. Sooryavanshi was unused in Ireland, as India suffered a shock 2-0 series loss.

"In my opinion, in the history of the IPL, perhaps after that season of Virat Kohli when he scored so many runs, if one season has to be defined, it is Vaibhav Sooryavanshi's IPL, IPL 2026. The kind of performances he has put in against top-quality bowlers, even though in Indian conditions, have been top-notch. "I have full faith in his ability to score big runs.



Not only Indian fans but the entire world is waiting to see Vaibhav Sooryavanshi play in the same manner that he did in the IPL. I have high hopes for this young lad. Very soon, we will see him in all three formats. I am dead sure about it," said Karim on JioStar. He also recalled of the time when Sooryavanshi first burst in IPL 2025 and didn't expect him to get big runs. "I didn't expect him to score in his very first year. But before last season's IPL, I remember getting a lot of videos from all his coaches, Manish Ojha from the Patna academy, our Bhojpuri commentator Robin, and a few others, saying, 'Sir, you have to

watch him. He's a kid, but he has great timing.' "When he was bought in the auction, I was just hoping that he would get a chance to play at least once because I wanted the world to see that India now has such a talented player. Just imagine, you're playing your first match on such a big platform, up against a top-quality bowler who has played for India. He had no baggage whatsoever. The first ball he faced, he completely dismissed the bowler from his sight. This is what Vaibhav Sooryavanshi is all about."

Dismissing concerns that the youngster would suffer from second-season blues after opposition ana-

lysts figured out his game, Karim revealed of his reassuring conversation with RR batting coach Vikram Rathour.

"Even after he scored that record 170-odd in the Under-19 World Cup final, everybody still felt that in the second season, it was possible that bowlers would come with definite plans against him and cause him problems, targeting his body and identifying areas to trouble him.

"But I didn't feel that he would have second-season blues. I felt that he was well prepared, and he batted in the same way. I remember having a chat with Vikram Rathour, who is the batting coach at Rajasthan Royals, where I asked him if Vaibhav could find it challenging against top-quality bowling or short-pitched deliveries at 145-150 clicks. He said, 'Saba, just wait and watch.' I think he is equally prepared to handle any kind of delivery," he said. Karim went on to praise Sooryavanshi's high cricketing IQ and his rapid adaptability, noting how the left-hander expanded his shot range to counter targeted bowling.

Alongside parallel criminal defamation charges, GITAM has issued legal notices to 69 social media account holders for propagating demonstrably false content across X (formerly

Twitter), YouTube, Facebook, and Instagram. According to GITAM authorities, KK Raju have repeatedly claimed in speeches that a "backdoor process" was used for land grabbing, alleging a blatant abuse of power by the institution. These speeches were widely circulated across local news channels including Sakshi TV, Leader Newspaper, R Star TV, Great Andhra News, and VTV Prime - and multiple social media handles. GITAM stated that videos of routine, legal construction on its campus were

deliberately spun into a false narrative to mislead the public. In a dual-pronged approach, the university has also issued formal notices to the governing bodies of Meta, Google, X, and the News Broadcasters & Digital Association (NBDA), demanding platform-level accountability and the immediate removal of the offending content. Notably, this is not the first time Sakshi Group has faced legal action from GITAM. In a near-identical past instance of alleged misinformation,

the Sakshi newspaper lost a defamation case against the university, received a formal warning from the court, and was directed to pay compensation. GITAM argues that this repeat behavior underscores a willful, intentional assault on its reputation. To support its position, GITAM has submitted documents before the appropriate legal forums, including approvals from relevant municipal, aviation, fire, district administration and other statutory authorities associated with the project.

Work on VBG Ramji scheme begins in Jinnam village Minister Kondapalli Srinivas

Unable to bear the alleged pressure, Akhila reportedly consumed pesticide. She was shifted to a private hospital in Vizianagaram for treatment but succumbed on Wednesday.

Police also said that Ramunaidu later consumed pesticide and is currently undergoing treatment at Cheepurupalli



Hospital. Based on a complaint lodged by the victim's father, Garividi Sub-Inspector B. Lokeshwara Rao has registered a case and is investigating the circumstances leading to the woman's death. Police said further action will be taken based on the outcome of the investigation.
